The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Frank Alexander Mackey, Esq., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of Chevalier (First Class) of the Order of St. Olav, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Norway, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him in the capacity of honorary Consul of Norway at Georgetown, British Guiana.

(4) Of women over 18 years of age in cream-centre making and boiling at the works of Messrs. James Keiller & Son Ltd., Albert Square, Dundee, subject to conditions similar to those under (3).
