At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 3rd day of October, 1935.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of September, 1935 (C.W. 6727/35), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, to authorise us to continue the grant of commissions to Ministers of Religious Bodies not in conformity with the Church of England who are rendering whole time service in the Royal Navy, and to provide that they shall be designated 'Temporary Chaplains' and shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to Chaplains on the permanent list of the Royal Navy for purposes of full pay and allowances:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of February, 1935, to approve revised conditions of service for Church of England Chaplains, and these revised conditions necessitate some modification in the conditions of service of Temporary Chaplains:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that some provision should be made for the grant of retired pay and withdrawal gratuities to Temporary Chaplains:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the proposals contained in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

" PART I.

"Temporary Chaplains entered into the Royal Navy on or after the 25th December, 1934.

"1. Full PAY.—The following scales of full pay to be substituted for the current and consolidated scales of full pay laid down in Section II, Part I, of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 29th June, 1934, and Section II, Part I, of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 9th November, 1934, respectively; the consolidated scale to be effective

from the 1st July, 1935, as prescribed in Order in Council of the 4th May, 1935:-

"2. Allowances.—The rules laid down in Clause 2 of the Schedule to Order in Council of the 26th May, 1927, to be applicable for determining the rates of allowances, except that Temporary Chaplains shall not be eligible for allowances on the scales applicable to Captains,

"3. RETIRED PAY AND GRATUITIES:-

(a) Temporary Chaplains with 10 or more but less than 20 years' Naval service.

Such Officers who resign voluntarily, who are withdrawn from the Naval Service by their Governing Bodies, or who are invalided on account of a non-attributable disability to be eligible, at Admiralty discretion, for gratuities on the following scale:-

... 1,000 After 10 years' service 1,500 ••• "

(b) Temporary Chaplains with 20 years' Naval service or over.

To be eligible, as from 1st July, 1935, for retired pay on the following scale, subject to a maximum of £543 a year:

(c) Temporary Chaplains retired in consequence of sickness or injury which is certified by the Naval Medical Authorities to be directly attributable to the conditions of Naval Service.

(i) Officers with 10 years' Naval service and over: -To be eligible as from 1st July, 1935, for retired pay at the rate of £181 a year for 10 years' service with additions of £13 10s. a year for each additional full year of service from the 11th to the 19th complete year, then as under (b) above; together with additional retired pay, while the attributable disability lasts, on the scale laid down in Clause 1 of Schedule I of Order in Council of the 11th October, 1923, subject to the conditions prescribed in that Order in Council. Gratuities under (a) above not to be payable in addition.

(ii) Officers with less than 10 years' Naval service: To be eligible for disability retired pay, while the attributable disability lasts, on the scales laid down in Clause 2 of Schedule II of Order in Council of the 11th October, 1923, subject to the conditions prescribed in that Order in Council, on the following basis:-

With and over 6 years' and under 10 years' service—as for Lieutenant-Com-

manders, R.N.
Under 6 years' service—as for Lieutenants, R.N.

" Part II.

"Temporary Chaplains entered before the 25th December, 1934.

These Officers to be given the option of remaining under the conditions of service then existing or of accepting the conditions of service laid down in Part I of this Schedule,

subject to the following provisions:—
(i) Temporary Chaplains who entered the Service before the 1st January, 1927, to remain eligible for allowances on the Captains' scale on attainment of 15 years' seniority as prescribed in existing regula-

tions.

(ii) Temporary Chaplains who elect to remain under the conditions existing prior to the 25th December, 1934, to be eligible as from 1st July, 1935, for retired pay after 12 years' Naval service, subject to attainment of the age of 40, on the scale of £204 a year for 12 years' service with an addition of £13 10s. a year for each complete year of service in excess of 12. If invalided in consequence of sickness or injury which is certified by the Naval Medical Authorities to be directly attributable to the conditions of Naval service, such Chaplains if eligible for Service Retired Pay to receive additional disability retired pay as laid down in Part I, Clause 3 (c) (i).

" PART III. GENERAL.

"1. The rates of retired pay and gratuity laid down not to be applicable to officers removed from the Service for misconduct.

"2. The grant of retired pay or gratuity to Officers invalided to be subject to the provisions of Order in Council of 28th July, 1930.

"3. The provisions of this Schedule shall have effect from the 25th December, 1934, except where otherwise stated."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by clause (1) of the Schedule to Your Order in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1924, to establish two Greenwich Hospital Pensions of £40 a year for Quartermasters of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force:

"And whereas no provision exists for the award of Greenwich Hospital Pensions to the following Officers of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force:—

Directors of Music.

Musical Directors.

Company Officers, Royal Naval School of Music.

Chief Schoolmasters.

Captains and Lieutenants promoted from Royal Marine Gunner.

"And whereas we consider that these Officers should be eligible to participate in the Pensions allocated to Quartermasters, Royal Marines, subject to the provisions of Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1924, and the 9th day of October, 1924:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to give directions accordingly with effect from the 9th day of August, 1935."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5. c. 46) (hereinafter called "the Act") was pleased to make the Copyright (Rome Convention) Order, 1933 (S.R. & O. 1933 (No. 253)) (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"):

And whereas the City of the Vatican has acceded to the International Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works signed at Rome on the 2nd day of June, 1928 (Treaty Series No. 12 (1932)):

And whereas by Section 32 of the Act it is provided that His Majesty in Council may make Orders for altering, revoking or varying any Order in Council made under the Act, but that any Order made under the said Section should not affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date when the Order comes into operation, and should provide for the protection of such rights and interests:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:—

- 1. The Principal Order shall have effect as if:
 - (a) in Article 1 the City of the Vatican were included amongst the foreign countries of the Copyright Union named therein;
 - (b) at the end of the Third Schedule there were inserted the following words and figures:—

- (c) in Article 3 the words and figures "3rd October, 1935" were substituted for the words "date of this Order" in the relation of that Article to any work to which the Act is applied by virtue of this Order.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date of this Order by virtue of the Principal Order.
- 3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Rome Convention) (Vatican City) Order, 1935.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"1. There is in the County of Gloucester and our Diocese of Gloucester the Rectory or Benefice of Bromsberrow the Parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about two hundred and twenty-four. The net annual value of the Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty Glebe Lands fees and other sources is three hundred and ninety pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Mary the Virgin Bromsberrow contains two hundred and twenty sittings.

"2. There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Dymock

containing an estimated present population of about one thousand one hundred. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe Rentcharge Grants from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty Glebe Lands fees and other sources is three hundred and seventy-five pounds or thereabouts. The Parish Church of St. Mary the Virgin Dymock contains four hundred sittings.

"3. The said Parish of Dymock includes the hamlets of Bromsberrow Heath and Lintridge which are contiguous to the said parish of Bromsberrow and the boundaries of which are delineated and verged pink on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and containing an estimated present population of one hundred and thirty-eight or thereabouts. The centre of the said hamlets of Bromsberrow Heath and Lintridge is about one mile distant from the Parish Church of St. Mary the Virgin Bromsberrow aforesaid and about three miles distant from the Parish Church of St. Mary the Virgin Dymock aforesaid.

"4. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the said hamlets known as Bromsberrow Heath and Lintridge may be advantageously separated from the said Vicarage of Dymock and annexed to the said Rectory of Bromsberrow.

"5. The Rectory of Bromsberrow is in the Patronage of us and our successors Bishops of Gloucester. The Vicarage of Dymock is in the Patronage of the Right Honourable William

Patronage of the Right Honourable William Lygon, Earl Beauchamp.

"6. The Reverend William Henry Hanna is the present Incumbent of the Rectory of Bromsberrow. The Reverend Sidney Marston, Master of Arts, is the present Incumbent of the Vicarage of Dymock.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralities Act we the said Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes Rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested: And we hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Bromsberrow and Dymock and of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

"It is proposed:-

"That the portion of the Vicarage of Dymock consisting of the hamlets of Bromsberrow Heath and Lintridge the boundaries of which are well known and defined and are delineated on the Plan hereunto annexed and thereon verged pink shall be separated from the said Vicarage of Dymock and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Rectory of Bromsberrow.

"That the Incumbent of the said Rectory of Bromsberrow to which the said portion of the Vicarage of Dymock shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls therein.

"That the Parishioners of the said portion of the said Vicarage of Dymock shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Bromsberrow but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said Parish of Dymock excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing the legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Church of Dymock and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same rights to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnised and performed in the Parish Church of Bromsberrow but for the said separation they might have had in the

Parish Church of Dymock.

"That all fees dues and ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion of the said Vicarage of Dymock so as aforesaid to be annexed to the said Rectory of Bromsberrow shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Rectory of Bromsberrow who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Dymock.

"That no alterations shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them. That no alterations shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of

them.

" Consents.

"I, the Right Honourable William Lygon, Earl Beauchamp, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Vicarage of Dymock (in case the same were now vacant) the Reverend Sidney Marston the Incumbent of the same Benefice we Arthur Cayley Bishop of Gloucester by virtue of our Bishopric the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Bromsberrow (in case the same were now vacant) and the Reverend William Henry Hanna the Incumbent of the same Benefice do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Chichester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following

"I, the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Chichester, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace that there are in the County of Sussex and my Diocese of Chichester the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham and the Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John and the District Chapelry of St. Richard Aldwick the limits and boundaries of the said Parishes and District Chapelry respectively being well known.

"That on the eastern side of the said District Chapelry of St. Richard Aldwick and immediately abutting thereon lies a certain contiguous part of the said Parish of Pagham (coloured green on the plan annexed hereto and hereinafter referred to as 'the contiguous area') which abuts on the western boundary of the said Parish of Bognor St. John and which I consider might with advantage be annexed to the said Parish of Bognor St.

"That the boundaries of the said Parishes of Pagham and Bognor St. John and the said District Chapelry of St. Richard Aldwick are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon the said Parish of Pagham is coloured yellow and the said Parish of Bognor St. John is coloured red and the said District Chapelry of St. Richard Aldwick is coloured blue.

"That the population of the said Parish of Pagham is approximately eight hundred and fifty persons and the population of the said Parish of Bognor St. John is approximately eight thousand persons.

"That the population of the contiguous area

is approximately five hundred persons.
"That the said Parish Church of Bognor St. John is conveniently situate for and adapted to the accommodation of the inhabitants of the contiguous area the most distant portion being one mile and a quarter more or less from the said Parish Church of Bognor St. John.

"That good roads lead from all parts of the contiguous area to the said Parish Church of Bognor St. John.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or landowners of the contiguous area possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive right of any pews or sittings in the said Parish Churches of Pagham and Bognor St. John respectively.

"That the Patronages of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham and of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor

St. John belong to your Grace.

"That the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham is the Reverend Grosvenor Goode Knox and the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John is The Reverend Prebendary Kenneth Clarke.

"That it appears to me that the contiguous area may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Pagham and annexed to the said Parish of Bognor St. John under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the Session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and six.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the said Grosvenor Goode Knox and Kenneth Clarke to the intent that your Grace may if after full inquiry and consideration you should be satisfied with the said Scheme certify the same and such Consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

" SCHEME.

"That there shall be separated from the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham and be united to and be deemed part and parcel of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John for ecclesiastical purposes all that contiguous part of the Parish of Pagham coloured green on the said plan annexed hereto and hereinafter called 'the contiguous area'.

"That the contiguous area shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John and the Incumbent of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That no part or portion of the rent charge given in lieu of tithes on the lands within the said Parish of Pagham under the provisions of the Act for the Commutation of Tithes in England and Wales or other the endowments of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham shall be assigned or attached to the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages churchings burials and other ecclesiastical solemnised and performed within the Parish or Parish Church of Bognor St. John in respect of the contiguous area shall hence-forth belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Vicarage of the Parish

Church of Bognor St. John.

"That the inhabitants of the contiguous area shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the said Parish Church of Pagham and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Pagham but shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of the said Parish of Bognor St. John to accommodation in the Church of that Parish and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Act One thousand eight hundred and sixty eight jointly with the parishioners of the said Parish of Bognor St. John for the repairs of the said Parish Church of Bognor St. John.

"Consents.

"We the Reverend Grosvenor Goode Knox the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Pagham and The Reverend Prebendary Kenneth Clarke Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish Church of Bognor St. John do hereby respectively signify our consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this eighth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty five.

"We Cosmo Gordon Lord Archbishop of Canterbury the Patron by virtue of Our Archbishopric of both the said benefices of Pagham and Bognor St. John hereby signify our consent to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

THE MIDLAND (AMALGAMATED) DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 26 of the Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments, and prescribe the 7th day of October, 1935, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended in the following manner, that is to say:-

- A. Clause 16 of the Scheme shall have effect
- There were added to the proviso to subclause (h) thereof the following paragraph:-
 - "(iii) of any export supply quota tonnage acquired by allotment from the Tonnage Pool under the provisions of subclause (m) of this Clause".
 - II. In sub-clause (j) thereof the words "except as otherwise provided in sub-clause (m) of this Clause" were inserted after the word "shall" where that word first occurs.

III. At the end of the said Clause the following sub-clause were added:-

" Export Tonnage Pool.

- (m) (i) Every Coalowner who shall have in his possession at the end of any month a shortage of Export Supply (herein called "Export Supply Shortage") shall be deemed to have registered one quarter thereof with the Secretary, and the Secretary shall open an Export Tonnage Pool Account in the name of each such Coalowner; provided that the Quota Committee shall have power in any month to resolve that a higher proportion than one quarter (but not exceeding one half) of each Coalowner's Export Supply Shortage at the end of that month shall be deemed to be registered with the Secretary.
- (ii) The tonnage so registered shall form an Export Tonnage Pool (herein called "the Pool") from which tonnage (herein called "Pool Tonnage") may be allotted to any Coalowner as hereinafter in this sub-clause provided.

- (iii) Any Coalowner desiring an allotment of Pool Tonnage shall make application in writing to the Secretary, stating the amount of Pool Tonnage which he desires to have allotted to him and the detailed grounds on which the application is made.
- (iv) The Export Committee shall from time to time consider all applications for allotment, and shall allot to each applicant such Pool Tonnage as they shall deem necessary having regard to the grounds specified by each Coalowner in his application and to all other material circumstances not excluding prices.
- (v) The price per ton at which Pool Tonnage is allotted during any month shall be sixpence.
- (vi) Payments for Pool Tonnage shall be made by each Coalowner receiving an allotment not later than the last day of the month in which such tonnage is allotted. The amount of such payments shall be distributed by the Secretary each month among the Coalowners who passed such tonnage into the Pool according to the quantity of Pool Tonnage allotted on behalf of each such Coalowner.
- (vii) All allotments of Pool Tonnage shall be deemed to be made on account of all Coalowners who shall have Pool Tonnage standing to their credit and all such allotments shall be allocated rateably and in proportion to the amount of the Pool Tonnage of each Coalowner at the time when the allotments were made.
- (viii) Tonnage in the Pool at 30th April in any year shall not be deemed to be cancelled unless the Quota Committee shall otherwise decide.
- (ix) The Quota Committee shall have power to resolve at any time that no further Export Supply Shortage shall be deemed to be registered in the Pool during such period as they shall decide.
- (x) Every Coalowner receiving an allotment of Pool Tonnage shall be entitled to raise such excess output (but no more) as shall enable him to supply the amount of such allotment and the Executive Board shall reduce or cancel (as the case may be) any penalty incurred by a Coalowner in respect of any excess output to the extent that the excess shall have been necessary for the purposes of this sub-clause. the event of any penalty being cancelled or reduced by the Executive Board under the provisions of this sub-clause the tonnage of output in respect of which the penalty was so reduced or cancelled shall not be carried forward and debited under the provisions of sub-clause (4) of Clause 18 of the Scheme.
- (xi) All Pool Tonnage allotted shall be deemed to be part of the monthly permitted export supply of the Coalowners to whom an allotment has been made and no portion of such allotted Pool Tonnage shall be sold or supplied as part of any Coal-owner's monthly permitted Inland supply.
- (xii) The Executive Board shall appoint an independent arbitrator to whom any dispute arising out of the provisions of

- this sub-clause shall be referred for decision. The arbitrator immediately upon appointment shall give directions as to the procedure to be followed and as to the method of conducting arbitrations and the provisions of paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Clause 28 of the Scheme shall not apply to such arbitrations."
- B. Clause 17 of the Scheme shall have effect as if at the end of sub-clause (d) thereof there were added the following paragraph:-
 - " (vi) to carry out the duties prescribed for them by sub-clause (m) of Clause 16 hereof."
