Genoua, August 9. N. S.

HE Centurion Man of War, Capt. Price Commander, which arrived here sometime ago from Oftend, sailed on the 22th of the last month for Alicant and Cadiz. On the 2d Instant the Bailly of Noailles came into this Port with 20 French Galleys, and soon after his arrival the Senate sent two Noblemen to Compliment him, which he returned by one of his chief Officers. The Duke of Tursis went also and paid him a Visit, which the Bailly of Neailles returned the same day; and on the 5th Instant he sailed hence for Leghorne. Yesterday the Galleys of Tursis set sail for Naples. There has lately happened some Difference between this Republick and the Great Duke of Tuscany about the Limits of their respective Dominions, upon which the Duke of Parma having offered his Mediation, the Republick has sent Signior Gritts to Parma, to adjust that Affair with the Minister whom the Duke of Tuscany is likewise sending thither.

Legherne, Aug. 11. On the 7th Instant 20 French Galleys under the Command of the Bailly of Noailles, came in here from Marfeilles, but last from Genoua; and the next day they sailed again for Civita-Veschia and the Coast of Naples. This day arrived here from Gallepoli an English Merchant Ship commanded by Capt. William Arthur. The Legherne Galley is Lading here, and will shortly sail for London.

Warfaw, Aug. 15. We have received an Actount, that the King of Poland came on the 7th Instant to Seberseczin, and intended to be this day at Lemberg, at which place he is to have a meeting with the Czar, who it's believed is already arrived there. The Army of the Crown is encamped at Monasterzick, and the King's German Troops are marching to Halierz, which is appointed for their Rendezvous, and 'tis expected that by the end of this month they will be all joined together. It is yet uncertain whether the King will besiege Caminieck, or march first into Moldavis and Walachia; which Provinces have made several Steps towards putting themselves under the Protection of this Crown. The Turks make all the Provision they can for the Defence of Caminiec, and we hear a great Body of Tartars are lately come from Budziack and the Patts adjacent and are successful.

Vienna, Aug. 16. The Emperor's Ministers have been several times in Conference upon the Business about which my Lord Pager's Secretary is come hirher, and it is faid they will dispatch him back in a faw days, with such an Answer to the Message he brought from the Grand Signior as will in all likelihood much advance the Negociation for a Peace. and Ammunition were this week sent down the Danube for the Service of the Emperor's Forces in Hungary. Our Letters from thence of the 9th Instant advise, that the Imperial Army encamped the 7th near Batsch, where they continued the 8th; The 9th they marched again, and the Foot incamped near Bukin, and the Horse overagainst 18ock, where Prince Engene had his Head Quarters. These Advices add, that the Aga of the Janizaries was deily expected at Belgrade with part of the Turkish Army, and that the Grand Visier followed with the rest of their Forces. We have an account from Slavonia, that a Party of Germans having taken several Prisoners, and some Cattle near the Castle of Oftrosas, the Turks sent out a Party in order to recover the Booty, but came too late; after which the Enemy attacked the Castle of Novi, and were repulsed.

Francfort, Aug. 24. The Elector Palatine came

the 19th Instant to Weynheim, and several of the Neighbouring Princes have sent their Ministers thither to Compliment him on his arrival in the Palaxinate. It is believed his Electoral Highness will go in a short time to Darmstadt to Visit the Landtgrave of Darmstadt, and that afterwards he will come to this Place, and from hence will return to Duseldorp. We hear the demolishing of Bridge near Brisac is almost sinished, and that that Town will be evacuated by the French in a sew days. The Elector of Montz is expected back at Menz this day from Aschassienburg. The Landgrave William of History Rhinflds passed by that place some days ago in his way to Rhinflds. They write from Lorraine, that the French have made an end of dismartling the City of Nancy, pursuant to the Treaty of Rysnick, and their Troops are preparing to march from thence.

Bruffels, Aug. 28.
