ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

Amended Regulations made on the 27th September, 1935, by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the amended Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council on or before the 23rd day of November, 1935.

The Architects Registration Council at their Meeting held on the 27th September, 1935, re-

solved that the existing Regulations be amended in manner following:—

Delete Regulation 2 and substitute therefor the following:—

2. "The Ordinary Meetings of the Council shall be held in the months of March, June, September and December in every year on such dates and at such places and hours as may be fixed by the Council. The Annual Meeting of the Council shall be held in the month of March in every year and shall precede the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held in the same month."

Delete Regulation 8 (i) and substitute therefor the following:—

8. (i) "At the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held in the month of March in every year the members present shall elect a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman who shall respectively hold office until the close of the Annual Meeting in the succeeding year, but shall be re-eligible. At the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held in the month of March in every year the Council shall appoint the Board of Architectural Education and the Admission Committee in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 (i) of the Act and the Discipline Committee in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the Act."

Delete Regulation 11 and substitute therefor the following:—

11. "The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall consist of not less than fifteen and not more than twenty members. The said Committee shall be appointed at the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held in the month of March in every year and the members thereof shall hold office until the close of the Annual Meeting to be held in the succeeding year."

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Aymer Douglas Maxwell to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
