

and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for assigning the right of Patronage of the District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of November, 1932, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, constituted partly out of the New Parish of Saint Luke, New Catton, partly out of the Parish of Hellesdon, and partly out of the Parish of Heigham, all in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas no assignment of the Patronage of the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, was made by the said Order and no such assignment has since been made:

"And whereas a capital sum of upwards of £12,000 has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross:

"And whereas the said capital sum has been so contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas Miss Violet Edith Wills, of Bel Alp, Haytor, in the County of Devon, Spinster, as the contributor of the above mentioned capital sum has nominated to us herself, the said Violet Edith Wills, the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, Brigadier-General Frank Dutton Frost, C.B.E., M.C., of Watersmeet, Moulsoford-on-Thames, in the County of Berks, the Reverend Colin Causton Kerr, of Number 5, Osborne Mansions, London, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Hubert Karl Archibald, of Number 5, Harley Gardens, The Boltons, London, Esquire, as the persons to whom she desires that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Catherine, Mile Cross, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Violet Edith Wills; Bertram, Bishop of

Norwich; Frank Dutton Frost; Colin Causton Kerr; and Hubert Karl Archibald, their heirs and assigns for ever, as Trustees upon the trusts declared by a certain Deed already prepared and intended to be executed by the said Violet Edith Wills; Bertram, Bishop of Norwich; Frank Dutton Frost; Colin Causton Kerr; and Hubert Karl Archibald.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.
