FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1935 (No. 36).

SUBJECT.

(i) Contracts, as from 1st November, 1935, the Warwickshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as described in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1935 (Nos. 30 and 32) to the Area as described in the First Schedule to this Order, and

(ii) Releases the Warwickshire Infected Area from restrictions and Revokes Orders Nos. 5351 and 5355 as from the 8th November, 1935.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Warwick.

So much of the parishes of Tanworth, Wootton Waven and Beaudesert as is comprised within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point where the Stratford-on-Avon Canal crosses the Birmingham-Stratford-on-Avon Road at Hockley Heath; thence following the canal in a north-westerly direction to the point where it crosses Lady Lane; thence along Lady Lane in a southerly direction to its junction with the road from Hockley Heath to Earlswood near Earlswood Pumping Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the road to Grimes Hill to the point where it crosses the road from Dickens Heath to Portway; thence in a south-westerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the Birmingham-Alcester Road near the Rose and Crown Inn; thence in a southerly direction along the latter road via Branson's Cross to the point where the Henley-in-Arden road forks off at Gorcott Hill; thence along the latter road via Ullenhall Street and May's Hill Farm to its junction with the Stratford-on-Avon-Birmingham road at Littleworth; and thence in a northerly direction along the latter road to the point of commencement.
