PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of October, 1935 (C.W. 8421/35), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas in view of the considerable advance in the technique of deep sea diving it is necessary that Warrant Officers and Officers promoted therefrom should qualify in deep sea diving, and when so qualified should give instruction in and take charge of deep diving:

“And whereas we consider that the special qualifications of these Officers and the increased responsibility devolving upon them justify additional remuneration:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of an allowance of one shilling a day to such Officers when qualified in deep sea

diving and actually holding appointments as Inspector of Diving, Diving Gunner at the Gunnery Schools at Portsmouth, Plymouth and Chatham, and Diving Gunner in Deep Diving Units of Your Majesty's Fleet.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5. c. 80), His Majesty in Council was pleased to make an Order, dated the 10th day of August, 1921, providing that, in the application to aircraft of the law relating to wreck and to salvage, and to the duty of rendering assistance to vessels in distress, the modifications and exemptions therein contained should be made, and conferring jurisdiction in certain matters as therein appears (S.R. & O. 1921 (No. 1286) p. 32):

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) In paragraph (13) of the principal Order, the words and figures "Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914" are hereby deleted and the following words and figures are substituted therefor: "Section 26 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932."

(2) This Order may be cited as the Aircraft (Wreck and Salvage) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1935, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Aircraft (Wreck and Salvage) Orders in Council, 1921 and 1935.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Rural Deaneries within the Archdeaconries of Chester and Macclesfield, both in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chester, has represented to us that it is desirable to make certain new arrangements (being the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed) with respect to the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Chester and Macclesfield:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the new arrangements now proposed by the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester, may properly be carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said Archdeaconry of Chester and the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield respectively shall comprise and consist of the Rural Deaneries, the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of each of the said two Archdeaconries respectively in the said Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every Parish or Cure or Church, the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said Schedule under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Chester or under the name of the said Archdeaconry of Macclesfield and under the name of any Rural Deanery in either of the said two Archdeaconries respectively, shall belong to and be and form a part of the Archdeaconry and of the Rural Deanery under the respective names of which it appears as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry and of the Rural Dean of such Rural Deanery respectively and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other Archdeaconry or Rural Deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

Civil Service Commission,

November 1, 1935.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give
notice that the following Regulations are pub-
lished with the approval of the Lords Com-
missioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT
COMMISSIONER UNDER THE NATIONAL SAVINGS
COMMITTEE.

N.B.—*Competitions under these regulations
are open both to men and women. Competi-
tions do not take place at fixed intervals, but
are held only on the occurrence of a vacancy.
The regulations are liable to alteration from
time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of
21, and must not have attained the age of 35
on the 1st April of the year in which the com-
petition is held.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born
British subject, the child of a person who is or
was at the time of death a British subject.
Provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a
civil situation to which they were admitted
with the certificate of the Civil Service Com-
missioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British
subjects who have satisfactorily completed a
period of not less than five years' service on
full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Com-
missioners are satisfied in the case of any
candidate who is a British subject, but does
not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as
to nationality and descent, that the candidate
is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing
with His Majesty's dominions that an excep-
tion may properly be made to that rule,
they may accept such candidate as eligible,

provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The National Savings Committee will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of a vacancy, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the National Savings Committee. The authorities of that Department will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and possess such knowledge as to fit them for the post. University training and a knowledge of economic subjects are desirable. The Civil Service Commissioners may submit all or any of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test their education or any part of it.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the authorities of the Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for appointment the candidate who appears to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. A candidate selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8 before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
