Civil Service Commission,

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give
notice that the following Regulations are pub-
lished with the approval of the Lords Com-
missioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT
COMMISSIONER UNDER THE NATIONAL SAVINGS
COMMITTEE.

N.B.—*Competitions under these regulations
are open both to men and women. Competi-
tions do not take place at fixed intervals, but
are held only on the occurrence of a vacancy.
The regulations are liable to alteration from
time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of
21, and must not have attained the age of 35
on the 1st April of the year in which the com-
petition is held.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born
British subject, the child of a person who is or
was at the time of death a British subject.
Provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a
civil situation to which they were admitted
with the certificate of the Civil Service Com-
missioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British
subjects who have satisfactorily completed a
period of not less than five years' service on
full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Com-
missioners are satisfied in the case of any
candidate who is a British subject, but does
not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as
to nationality and descent, that the candidate
is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing
with His Majesty's dominions that an excep-
tion may properly be made to that rule,
they may accept such candidate as eligible,
