The KING has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Bryan Bertram Bellew, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, late Lieutenant South Irish Horse, George Rothe Bellew, Member of the Royal Victorian Order, Somerset Herald of Arms, Patrick Herbert Bellew, Gwendoline Ada, Wife of Hugh Lloyd Thomas, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, a First Secretary in His Majesty's Diplomatic Service, and Ada Kate, Wife of Charles Barry Domville, the brothers and sisters of Edward Henry Bellew, Baron Bellew, Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as would have been due to them if their late father, Richard Eustace Bellew (commonly called the Honourable Richard Eustace Bellew) had survived his brother, George Leopold Bryan, Baron Bellew, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Bellew.

And to command that the said order and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

NORTHERN IRELAND LAND ACT, 1925
(15 AND 16 GEO. V. CHAPTER 34).

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 2 of the Northern Ireland Land Act,

1925, They have authorised the further creation of £5,150 Guaranteed 4½ per cent. Bonds, including £3,275 such Bonds for issue to the National Debt Commissioners and making with the amounts previously authorised a total of £6,556,125 such Bonds.
