A PROCLAMATION

DIRECTING THAT GOLD AND SILVER COINS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE SUB-DIVISIONS OF THE DOUBLOON SHALL CEASE TO BE LEGAL TENDER IN THE WEST INDIA COLONIES.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the third day of February, 1898, certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied with the modifications specified in the Proclamation to Our West India Colonies (including Our Colony of British Guiana):

And whereas it is provided by the said Proclamation that any coins coined in a foreign country which, at the date of the promulgation of the said Proclamation, were by law current and a legal tender in any Colony or Possession to which the said Proclamation extended should, until by Proclamation otherwise directed, continue to be so current and a legal tender at the same rate and up to the same amount as heretofore:

And whereas under the provisions so applied We may by Proclamation regulate any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within the present prerogative of the Crown which are not provided for by the Coinage Act, 1870, and may revoke or alter any Proclamation previously made:

And whereas at the date of the promulgation of the said Proclamation gold and silver coins

of the United States of America were by law current and a legal tender in Our West India Colonies or in certain of them:

And whereas it is expedient that the gold and silver coins of the United States of America should no longer be legal tender in any of Our West India Colonies (including Our Colony of British Guiana):

And whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of His late Majesty King Edward VII dated the 4th day of June, 1908, the doubloon ceased to be current or legal tender in any of Our West India Colonies (including Our Colony of British Guiana) and it is expedient that the several sub-divisions of the doubloon should likewise cease to be current or legal tender therein:

Now, therefore, We do hereby, in pursuance of the said recited provisions and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain, that the gold and silver coins of the United States of America and also the several sub-divisions of the doubloon shall as from the thirty-first day of December, 1935, cease to be current or legal tender in any of Our West India Colonies (including Our Colony of British Guiana) in which immediately before that date they or any of them are so current or legal tender.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and Thirty-five, and in the Twenty-sixth year of Our Reign.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may make such Orders in Council and do such things as appear to him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty of Peace signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and for giving effect to any of the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that any Order in Council made thereunder may provide for the imposition by summary process or otherwise of penalties in respect of breaches of the provisions thereof:

And whereas His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) Order, 1935 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") for the purpose of carrying out the said Treaty and giving effect to the Covenant of the League of Nations contained in Part I thereof:

And whereas for the purpose aforesaid it is expedient to vary the principal Order and to make such further provision as is hereinafter contained:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in British protectorates and territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, and is pleased by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise to extend the provisions of Article one of this Order to all such protectorates and to territories in respect of which such a mandate as aforesaid is being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Amendment of Article 2 of principal Order.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (1) of Article 2 of the principal Order, the Board of Trade may by licence authorise the importation of any goods which are prohibited to be imported by that paragraph if they are satisfied that the price of the goods was wholly paid on or before the nineteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-five.

(2) Any such licence may be issued by the President or a Secretary, Under-Secretary or Assistant-Secretary of the Board of Trade or any person authorised in that behalf by the President of the Board.

(3) The said paragraph (1) shall not apply to goods of any of the descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order.

(4) Article 5 of the principal Order shall apply for the purposes of this Article as it applies for the purposes of that Order.

Amendment of Article 3 of principal Order.

2.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the proviso to paragraph (2) of Article 3 of the principal Order, the delivery of goods the price

whereof has been paid on or before delivery in manner referred to in that proviso shall be deemed to be the making of a loan within the meaning of that Article unless—

(a) the price has been wholly paid before the eighteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-five; or

(b) the goods are in course of transit on the said date.

(2) This Article shall apply to the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands as it applies to the United Kingdom.

Settlement of certain Anglo-Italian debts.

3.—(1) The Treasury shall appoint a Controller of Anglo-Italian debts (hereinafter referred to as "the Controller"), and no debts to which this Article applies shall be paid otherwise than to the Controller in manner hereinafter provided.

(2) The debts to which this Article applies are all debts due before and owing on the eighteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, or due on or after that date, from persons ordinarily resident or ordinarily carrying on business in the United Kingdom to persons ordinarily resident or ordinarily carrying on business in the Kingdom of Italy in respect of—

(a) the sale of goods grown, produced or manufactured in the Kingdom of Italy (other than goods of any of the descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order which are imported into the United Kingdom on or after the said eighteenth day of November); or

(b) the carriage of any goods whatsoever from or to the United Kingdom to or from the Kingdom of Italy in ships registered under the law of the Kingdom of Italy.

(3) The following provisions shall have effect as respects the payment of debts to which this Article applies:—

(a) debts due on or before the said eighteenth day of November shall be paid to the Controller on that date;

(b) debts due after the said eighteenth day of November shall be paid to the Controller on the date on which they become due;

(c) payments shall be made to the Bank of England for the account of the Controller;

(d) debts due in Italian lire shall be paid in sterling at such rate of exchange as may be certified by the Controller to be the rate obtaining for the date of payment;

(e) debts due in any currency other than sterling or Italian lire shall, unless the Controller otherwise directs, be paid in that currency;

(f) on the payment of any sum to the Controller, he or the Bank of England on his behalf shall give a receipt therefor, and the receipt shall, so far as regards that sum, be a good discharge to the person paying it.

(4) Any assignment of a debt to which this Article would apply but for that assignment shall be void if the assignment is made after the date of the making of this Order.

(5) All sums received by the Controller under this Article shall be applied by him for the purpose of paying, in whole or in part and in such order and at such times as he thinks

fit, debts in respect of which Italian lire have been deposited in manner provided by Article 4 of the Agreement regarding trade and payments embodied in an exchange of notes dated the twenty-seventh day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Italian Government:

Provided that the Controller may pay such sums as the Treasury may from time to time approve into the special account mentioned in Article 5 of the said agreement.

(6) The Controller may require any person who appears to him to be liable under this Article to pay any sum to him to furnish him with such information and documents as he may from time to time require.

(7) If any person—

(a) pays any debt to which this Article applies in contravention of paragraph (1) of this Article; or

(b) fails to furnish any information or documents which he is required under the last foregoing paragraph to furnish and able to furnish; or

(c) furnishes under the last foregoing paragraph any information or documents which he knows to be false;

he shall be guilty of an offence and liable—

(i) on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to a fine or to both such imprisonment and fine; or

(ii) on summary conviction, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine;

and where any such offence by a body corporate is proved to have been committed with the consent or approval of, or to have been facilitated by any neglect on the part of, any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the body corporate, he as well as the body corporate shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

(8) On or before the first day of October in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-six and each succeeding year an account shall be prepared by the Controller, in such form and in such manner as the Treasury may direct, of the sums received and paid by him under this Article during the last preceding financial year, and the account shall be audited by the Comptroller and Auditor-General in such manner as the Treasury may direct.

(9) The Controller may sue in the name of the Controller of Anglo-Italian Debts.

(10) Anything required or authorised under this Order to be done by or to the Controller may be done by or to any person duly authorised by him in that behalf.

(11) This Article shall apply to the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands as if they were part of the United Kingdom.

Short title and interpretation.

4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as amended by any subsequent enactment, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

GOODS TO WHICH ARTICLE 2 (1) OF THE PRINCIPAL ORDER DOES NOT APPLY.

Newspapers, periodicals, printed books and printed music.

Maps and hydrographic charts.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Eastbourne, partly out of the Parish of Willingdon and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, all in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Eastbourne, the said Parish of Willingdon, and the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Eastbourne, of the said Parish of Willingdon, and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“And whereas Eliza Watson, late of ‘Leahurst’, Carlisle Road, Eastbourne aforesaid, Widow, who died on the 14th day of April, 1928, by a Codicil dated the 14th day of

October, 1927, to her Will dated the 24th day of June, 1927, devised the residue of her estate towards the cost of the provision of a Church, Parsonage House and Parish Hall in or near Eastbourne aforesaid, and for the provision of an endowment for the Incumbent of such Church, and directed that if her trustees should consider it practicable the patronage of the Church so built should be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which the same Church should be erected:

"And whereas Herbert Victor James, of Claremont Chambers, Eastbourne aforesaid, Solicitor, and the Public Trustee, being the Trustees of the said Will, have agreed to apply part of the residue of the aforesaid estate for the provision of a permanent Church for the said proposed separate District, and they have also out of such residue contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £20,000 to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and, so soon as such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, then of the said New Parish, and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being:

"And whereas we have in respect of the said sum of £20,000 agreed and undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, the sum of £600 per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £20,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Herbert Victor James and the Public Trustee, as the contributors of the said capital sum of £20,000, have nominated to us the Bishop of Chichester for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Eastbourne, of the said Parish of Willingdon, and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid,

become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Elizabeth, Eastbourne'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Elizabeth, Eastbourne, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Eastbourne, of the Parish of Willingdon, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, all in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which taken together are bounded upon all sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, from the said Parish of Eastbourne, at the junction of Baldwin Avenue, Milton Road and Chamberlain Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Chamberlain Road for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Green Street for a distance of $3\frac{3}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Northiam Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Northiam Street for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to a point at its south-western end, and extending thence due westward and in a straight line for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the bridle road leading from East Dean Road to Jevington, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said bridle road for a distance of $36\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the County Borough of Eastbourne, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along such County Borough Boundary (thereby following for the most part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Eastbourne from the said Parish of Willingdon) for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the eastern boundary of the Willingdon Golf Course diverges north-westward from such County Borough Boundary, and extending thence first north-westward, then northward and then north-eastward along the said

fence for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of the roadway forming the entrance to the said Golf Course, and extending thence first northward to and then north-eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Willingdon Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Willingdon Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Willingdon from the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne) for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the southern boundary of the roadway leading to Ocklynge Windmill, and extending thence westward to and along the said fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof (thereby continuing to follow the last mentioned boundary) for a distance in all of 7½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the fence which divides the close numbered 389 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the said County Borough of Eastbourne published in the year 1930 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 402 upon the same maps, and extending thence first westward, then southward, then again westward and then again southward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 389 and the close numbered 390 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 402 and the close numbered 401 upon the same maps for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 390 from the said close numbered 401 reaches the northern side of Eldon Road, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Eldon Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Baldwin Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Baldwin Avenue for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Milton Road and Chamberlain Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, from the said Parish of Eastbourne, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the United Parish of the Holy Trinity with Christ Church, Whitehaven, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said United Parish of the Holy Trinity with Christ Church, Whitehaven, is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said United Parish of the Holy Trinity with Christ Church, Whitehaven, which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas under the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 20th day of December, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of the following month, uniting the Benefice of Christ Church, Whitehaven, and the Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Whitehaven, both in the said County and Diocese, it was provided that a part of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Whitehaven, producing an income of £150 per annum should be accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the endowment of a new District to be constituted wholly or partly out of the Parish of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Whitehaven:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted is the new District to which the above-mentioned Order in Council has reference:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister

shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the yearly sum of £150 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Carlisle, as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said United Parish of the Holy Trinity with Christ Church, Whitehaven, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Peter, Kells'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of

them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Peter, Kells, being:—

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Radford has been improved by means of certain leases and sales of glebe lands and of minerals within and under the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which leases and sales were granted and carried out under the authority of the said Acts, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Radford:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Harrow on the Hill, partly out of the Parish of Great Stanmore, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Harrow Weald, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill, and partly out of the District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, all in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill, the said Parish of Great Stanmore, the said New Parish of Harrow Weald, the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill, of the said Parish of Great Stanmore, of the said New Parish of Harrow Weald, of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill, and of the said District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District for which a Church shall be built and endowed as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to transfer towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, the yearly sum or stipend amounting to £197 10s. 6d. and representing the interest or dividends arising in respect of (1) a sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum Stock, (2) a sum of £2,058 8s. 1d., £3 10s. 0d. per centum Conversion Stock, and (3) a sum of £2,182 17s. 8d. £3 per centum Funding Stock, which said yearly sum or stipend is at present payable towards the stipend of the

Curate in Charge of the Conventional District of Kenton:

"And whereas such yearly sum or stipend will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be transferred and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Harrow on the Hill, of the said Parish of Great Stanmore, of the said New Parish of Harrow Weald, of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Greenhill, and of the said District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Mary the Virgin, Kenton.'

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of April, 1845, and published in

the London Gazette on the 13th day of the following month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parishes of Woolwich and Charlton, both in the said County of Kent, and at that time in the Diocese of Rochester but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Woolwich':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 1st day of November, 1862, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the same month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the said Parish of Charlton, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Paul, Charlton':

"And whereas the said District of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, and the said District of Saint Paul, Charlton, duly became New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 1st day of August, 1908, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month, the said Parish of Charlton and the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Charlton, were united into one Parish, and such united Parish is now called or known as 'The Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton':

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, and (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dis severed from the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, and to be restored to the Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, which is bounded upon the south-west by the said Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, crosses the middle of Hanging Wood Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Hanging Wood Lane for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Kinveachy Gardens, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Kinveachy Gardens for a distance of 13½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Woolwich, from the said Parish of Saint Luke with Saint Paul, Old Charlton.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the incomes of the Archdeaconry of London and the Archdeaconry of Middlesex, both in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 25th day of January, 1841, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of the same month, it was directed that a Canonry in the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London should be permanently annexed and united to the said Archdeaconry of London, and that one-third part of the income of such Canonry should be paid to the Archdeacon of Middlesex for the time being:

"And whereas by another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 9th

day of August, 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, it was directed (*inter alia*) that we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, should pay to the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London an annual sum of £18,000 and that one-eighteenth part of such annual sum should be appropriated for the income of each of the four Canons, subject as to the income of such one of the Canonries as is annexed to and held with the said Archdeaconry of London to the annual charge created in favour of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex by the hereinbefore mentioned Order in Council dated the 25th day of January, 1841:

"And whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Orders in Council dated respectively the 25th day of January, 1841, and the 8th day of August, 1872, should be varied and that the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex should be re-endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and such Archdeaconry has no ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto:

"And whereas there is at present payable to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the Archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex an annual sum of £6 in respect of the annual tenths formerly payable to the Bishop of London, and we have agreed to make a grant of such annual tenths in augmentation of the income of the said Archdeaconry:

"And whereas the Venerable the Honourable Stephen Henry Phillimore, now Archdeacon of Middlesex, is consenting to this Scheme:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and with the consent of the said Stephen Henry Phillimore, Archdeacon of Middlesex (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid and so long as the said Stephen Henry Phillimore continues to hold the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex, the payment to be made to the Archdeacon of Middlesex by the person holding the said Canonry annexed to the Archdeaconry of London shall cease to be one-third part of the income of the said Canonry and shall be an annual payment of £33 6s. 8d., and no more, and that as from the date of the next avoidance of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex the provision in the said Order in Council dated the 25th day of January, 1841, for the payment of one-third part of the income of the said Canonry to the Archdeaconry of Middlesex shall cease and determine.

"And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose that,

subject as in hereinafter mentioned, we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a yearly sum of £300 such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the said day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said annual tenths amounting to £6 payable to us by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex commencing with the yearly payment of those tenths due on Christmas Day, 1935, shall for ever cease to be payable.

"And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Middlesex, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon of Middlesex.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £300 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Middlesex shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been transmitted to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London and to the Archdeacons of London and Middlesex and they have respectively signified their assents thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of May, 1931, and relating to the Dean and Chapter of the said Collegiate Church of Saint Peter, Westminster, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 2nd day of the following month it was provided (*inter alia*) that there should continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter the annual sum of £3,250 and that there should be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the said annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,600 for the yearly stipend of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons (these stipend payments to be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a canonry and the reduction of the number of canons from six to five) and that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter should be applied for the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter:

"And whereas it was further provided by the same Order that the hereinbefore recited provisions should continue in force only for the period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1929:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be expedient that the said provisions should continue in force for a further period and also that the capitular accounts of the Dean and Chapter of Westminster should annually be sent to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"Now, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the said Westminster Abbey Measure, 1929, and after consultation as thereby prescribed with the Dean and Chapter of Westminster and with the approval of the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Viscount Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, exercising the authority of Your Majesty as Visitor as aforesaid, such approval being testified by his signature and seal being subscribed and affixed to this Scheme do humbly recommend and propose that from and after the 29th day of September, 1934, first, there shall continue to be paid to the Fabric Fund out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter an annual

sum of £3,250; secondly, there shall be applied out of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter (next after the provision of the lastly mentioned annual sum of £3,250) the annual sum of £9,600 for the yearly stipends of the Dean and the five Canons, being £3,000 for the Dean, £1,200 for each of the two Canons to whose canonries Rectories are annexed and £1,400 for each of the other three Canons, and that these payments shall be taken to include and cover any compensation allowance or expense incurred by reason of the suspension of a Canonry and the reduction of the number of Canons from six to five; and thirdly, that the residue of the annual income of the Dean and Chapter after the specific appropriations hereinbefore directed shall be appropriated and applied to the maintenance of the services of Westminster Abbey and other expenses of the Dean and Chapter; and that the foregoing provisions shall continue in force only for a further period of five years from the 29th day of September, 1934.

"And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose that the Dean and Chapter of Westminster shall annually within three months after the date thereof send to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the capitular accounts in full."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

N.B.—*Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department, by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise, to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended,

together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission, the Department and a nominee of the Surveyors' Institution.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

5. Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Chartered Surveyors' Institution, or the corresponding examination of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society or of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland, or hold a University Degree (e.g., B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge, or B.Sc. (Estate Management) London) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. They must have had at least four years' professional experience which may have been obtained in:—

(a) The Office of a F.S.I., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or member of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland in professional practice, or in Government or Municipal Service; or

(b) The Office of any other Surveyor, Estate Agent or Land Agent which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate training.

Time which has been spent in study of Agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College if followed by the obtaining of a Degree or Diploma will be allowed to count up to two years out of the four years.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

6. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department. Appointment will be subject to the condition that the person appointed may be required to serve in any town in Great Britain. Inland Revenue Valuers are not allowed to engage for profit in commercial dealings in land or houses whether directly or through an agent, or to accept any fee or reward whatsoever for professional or official services.

8. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces when called upon to do so the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate Education Authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

10. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £5.

HUDDERSFIELD CORPORATION (TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT).

ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by Section 7 of the Huddersfield Corporation (Tramway and Trolley Vehicles) Scheme, 1932 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme of 1932") confirmed by the Public Works Facilities Scheme (Huddersfield Corporation) Confirmation Act, 1932, and by Section 3 of the Huddersfield Corporation (Trolley Vehicles) Scheme, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme of 1934") confirmed by the Public Works Facilities Scheme (Huddersfield Corporation) Confirmation Act, 1934, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of

the Borough of Huddersfield (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") were authorised to use trolley vehicles on certain routes in the borough.

And whereas it is enacted in Section 17 of the Scheme of 1932 (inter alia) as follows:—

"(2) (a) The Minister of Transport may at any time by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of the tramways of the Corporation along the route of which the Corporation are authorised to provide and equip trolley vehicles under the provisions of this Scheme.

(c) Any Order made under the provisions of this sub-section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such Order and for the portion of the road upon which the tramway is situate to be left in good repair and condition."

And whereas by Section 5 of the Scheme of 1934 the provisions of Section 17 (2) (As to abandonment of tramways) of the Scheme of 1932 are applied to the trolley vehicles authorised by the Scheme of 1934.

And whereas by Section 7 of the Scheme of 1932 and by Section 3 of the Scheme of 1934, the Corporation are authorised to use trolley vehicles along the routes of the tramways authorised by the Acts and Orders hereinafter referred to, that is to say:—

1. *Tramways authorised by the Huddersfield Improvement Act, 1880.*

(a) So much of Tramway No. 7 as extends from its point of commencement in Lidget Street, Lindley, to the point of commencement of Tramway No. 12 authorised by the Huddersfield Corporation Tramways Act, 1900.

(b) Tramway No. 7A.

(c) So much of Tramway No. 9 as extends from the junction of Kirkgate with Castlegate to the point of termination of that Tramway in Wakefield Road.

(d) Tramways Nos. 9A, 9B and 9C.

2. *Tramways authorised by the Huddersfield Tramways and Improvement Act, 1890.*

(a) So much of Tramway No. 13 as extends from the point of termination of Tramway No. 1 authorised by the Huddersfield Corporation Tramways Order, 1898, to the point of termination of the said Tramway No. 13 at the junction of New Hey Road with Acre Street.

(b) Tramway No. 13B.

3. *Tramway authorised by the Huddersfield Corporation Tramways Order, 1898.*
