The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Stafford now vested in us:

“ Whereas the property particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

“ All those pieces or parcels of land in the Parish of Wolverhampton and the County of Stafford numbered 1, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13 and 15 containing respectively 42, 894, 201, 22, 22, 13, and 4 square yards and delineated and coloured blue on the plan drawn on a Deed of Exchange made the twenty-eighth day of February 1901 between The Right Honourable Lord Barnard of the one part, Edmund Charles Tennyson d'Eyncourt and Frederick William Fane of the second part, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part. And also all that piece or parcel of land containing 5 acres 1 rood 20 perches of land being plot Number 117 shown on the Ordnance Survey Map Number LVII. II. for the said Parish of Wolverhampton, for the year 1919.	Wolverhampton.	Stafford.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Lichfield.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd November, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th November, 1935, to Saturday, the 30th November, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the

following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

(7) To authorise the Council to purchase take on lease or otherwise acquire land and hereditaments for the purposes of the harbour undertaking and to grant easements.

(8) To empower the Council to maintain and improve the harbour and to construct maintain alter and improve all necessary embankments quays wharves jetties piers landing places approaches buildings buoys moorings groynes sluices works apparatus and conveniences.

(9) To authorise the Council for the purposes of the Order to deepen dredge scour and excavate the harbour the foreshore and bed of the sea and to appropriate and sell or dispose of any sand mud and other materials excavated and to acquire dredgers etc. for such purposes.

(10) To empower the Council to levy tolls rates duties and charges in connection with the harbour; to alter vary or repeal existing tolls rates duties and charges; to confer vary or extinguish exemptions from payment of tolls rates duties and charges; to make provision for compounding with respect thereto and for the revision of such tolls rates duties and charges.
