PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may make such Orders in Council and do such things as appear to him to be necessary for carrying out the Treaty of Peace signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and for giving effect to any of the provisions of the said Treaty:

And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that any Order in Council made thereunder may be varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2) Order, 1935, for the purpose of carrying out the said Treaty and giving effect to the Covenant of the League of Nations contained in Part I thereof:

And whereas for the purpose aforesaid it is expedient to vary the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Amendment of Article 3 of second Order.

1. Article 3 of the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 2)

Order shall have effect, and shall be deemed always to have had effect, as if the following paragraph were substituted for paragraph (2) thereof:—

“(2) The debts to which this Article applies are all debts due before and owing on the eighteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, or due on or after that date, from persons ordinarily resident or ordinarily carrying on business in the United Kingdom to persons ordinarily resident or ordinarily carrying on business in the Kingdom of Italy in respect of—

(a) the price of goods grown, produced or manufactured in the Kingdom of Italy and imported into the United Kingdom (other than goods of any of the descriptions set out in the Schedule to this Order which are so imported on or after the said eighteenth day of November); or

(b) any bill of exchange given by way of payment (whether absolute or conditional) of a debt in respect of any such price as aforesaid:

Provided that, where any such bill of exchange has been accepted on or before the fourteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, or where any such bill of exchange, being a cheque, has been drawn and delivered on or before the seventeenth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, this Article shall not apply to any debt in respect of the bill, or, if the bill was given by way of conditional payment, to the debt by way of payment of which the bill was given.

For the purposes of this paragraph any liability for damages in respect of the dishonour of a bill of exchange shall be deemed to be a debt due in respect of that bill."

Short Title and Interpretation.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Covenant of the League of Nations) (No. 3) Order, 1935.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as amended by any subsequent enactment, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Eyacinth D'Arcy, Mrs. Willison (wife of Major A. C. Willison, D.S.O., M.C., Royal Tank Corps, G.S.O.3, Headquarters, Western Command).

Major James Ernest Gray, M.B., B.Ch., B.A.O.(Belf.), Indian Medical Service, Civil Surgeon, Karachi, Bombay.

Hugh Weightman, Esq., of the Political Department, Political Agent, Kalat and Chagai, Baluchistan.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Albert Medal in each of the following cases for services rendered in connection with the recent earthquake in Baluchistan:—

Nurse Florence Alice Allen.

At the risk of her life, and at the cost of terrible injuries to her leg, Miss Allen saved the life of the child in her charge by throwing herself across the cot. She has displayed the highest courage ever since.

Lieutenant John Guise Cowley, Royal Engineers, 16th Army Troops Company, Q.V.O. Madras Sappers and Miners.

Lieutenant Cowley and his party were the first to start relief work at the Civil Hospital where the walls of all the wards had collapsed bringing down the roofs intact on the inmates on whom the debris of the walls had already fallen. At first the men were too few in number to tear off the roofs, so they raised them up for short periods whilst Lieutenant Cowley crawled under them and dragged out survivors from their beds. The survivors were pre-earthquake hospital patients and mostly quite helpless. Lieutenant Cowley lifted many men in his arms regardless of the warning that they were suffering from all manner of diseases. Had it not been for the work of this officer and the excellent example shown by him to his men, very many less men would have been saved alive.

Lance-Naik Firoze Khan, 5th Battalion, 8th Punjab (Burma) Regiment.

On the morning of May 31st Lance-Naik Firoze Khan was in charge of a party engaged in rescue work and fire fighting in the city. Hearing cries for help from beneath the ruins in the close vicinity of a fire, Lance-Naik Firoze Khan and his party commenced to dig and cut their way down into the building. After nearly two hours' work, the Lance-Naik was able to enter the building from above and discovered two people pinned down by beams and rubble. The fire had by this time spread to the building in question, which was full of smoke and fumes. In spite of this the Lance-Naik with pick and saw spent over half an hour beneath the ruins and finally released the injured people. He did this at great risk to his own life as throughout there was grave danger of the ruins subsiding from the effect of the fire and further earthquake shocks.

Private Harry Fitzsimmons, 1st Battalion, The West Yorkshire Regiment (The Prince of Wales's Own).

On the 31st May and 1st and 2nd June, 1935, Fitzsimmons was on rescue duty in the area of Quetta City to the east of Sandeman

Hall. He worked with conspicuous energy and devotion to duty throughout the period of rescue work, and in conjunction with others was responsible for saving several lives. On 1st June, in order to rescue an Indian whom he knew to be buried alive, Fitzsimmons, at great risk to his own life, made a passage under the debris of a house into which he was able to crawl. On reaching the man he discovered a woman lying dead on top of him, who was pinned down by a stout beam across her leg. In order to release the man, whom he eventually saved, he had to saw off the woman's leg with a carpenter's saw. The remains of the building, and the passage he made, were in imminent danger of collapse during the whole period he was working. Fitzsimmons' action was a very gallant one and worthy of special recognition.

Rifleman Harkbir Thapa, 2nd Battalion, 8th Gurkha Rifles.

On the morning of the 31st May, Rifleman Thapa was detailed as part of a rescue party which was going to dig out some living people behind the Police Lines. On the way to the work he heard noises in a building and obtained permission from the N.C.O. to try to get these people out. At about 6.30 a.m., the Adjutant visited the area to ascertain how work was progressing. He found Rifleman Harkbir Thapa had worked his way with his hands through the debris under a tottering roof, and was nearing two people who were alive but buried. As there was clearly every chance of the roof collapsing on top of him as he removed the debris, the Adjutant assisted him by propping up the roof as far as possible. Rifleman Harkbir Thapa continued his work and brought out two children alive. He undoubtedly saved those two children at the risk of his own life. On 2nd June this Rifleman's conduct was again brought to notice. On this occasion he formed part of a detachment working in Hudda Village. The upper storey of a crumbling house was being cleared, part of the roof had fallen through the floor into the lower storey, thus rendering the floor most dangerous. A living child was discovered in the lower storey. This man and one other volunteered to dig through a corner of the floor opposite to where it had crumbled. They did so with khukries and their hands and got through to the lower storey and rescued the child. They did this at considerable risk to their own lives, as the walls were in danger of falling and the floor might have collapsed at any moment.

Lance-Naik Hukam Dad, 5th Battalion, 8th Punjab (Burma) Regiment.

In the early morning of 31st May, while employed in rescue work in the city, Lance-Naik Hukam Dad fought his way into the ruins of a burning house at considerable risk to his own life and rescued a woman who was imprisoned there. Two injured men had already perished in the flames, and it was only through the bravery and presence of mind of Hukam Dad that the woman was saved.

Lance-Naik Kabul Singh, 4th Battalion, 19th Hyderabad Regiment.

On the morning of the 31st May, 1935, Lance-Naik Kabul Singh at great risk and personal danger to his life entered a tumbled down burning house in Bruce Road and succeeded in rescuing two women and three children.

Private Robert Spoors, 1st Battalion, The West Yorkshire Regiment (The Prince of Wales's Own).

After the earthquake on the morning of 31st May, Private Spoors, at very considerable risk to himself from falling debris, entered Major O'Hanlon's house, which was in a dangerous condition. He was successful in clearing a path for Mrs. O'Hanlon and was mainly responsible for saving her life. He then re-entered the house to save the nurse and baby, but was himself caught in the debris and was later rescued by two other men and brought out in an exhausted condition. He subsequently worked for long hours at the British Military Hospital. His action was reported by the Colonel Commanding the Hospital with a recommendation for special recognition; the facts being corroborated by Major O'Hanlon, R.A.M.C. Private Spoors' gallant behaviour and devotion to duty were most praiseworthy.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned for services rendered in connection with the recent earthquake in Baluchistan:—

For Gallantry.

No. 12407 Havildar (Acting Havildar-Major) Ahmad Yar, 24th Mountain Brigade, Royal Artillery.

On the night of 31st May—1st June, 1935, in Sandeman Road, Quetta, this Non-commissioned Officer for a period of five and a half hours worked in a hole about fifteen feet below a very unsafe wall, extricating a man who was eventually found to be unharmed. During the period there were several shocks of great intensity, and in any of these there was the grave risk of being buried. This Non-commissioned Officer as a Havildar-Major was on continuous duty from the time of the earthquake until the Battery returned to its lines on the evening of 3rd June, 1935. He never failed to set the highest possible standard of leadership, discipline, and personal work.

No. 6396138 Private Arthur Brooks, 1st Battalion, The Queen's Royal Regiment (West Surrey).

On the afternoon of 31st May, 1935, Private Brooks at great personal risk rescued a man from beneath the debris of a building in Suraj Ganj Bazaar behind the City Thana. A party of military policemen had located a man lying some eighteen feet beneath debris and close to a wall in a very

dangerous condition. They dug down with picks and shovels to a point within some five feet of the man, when from the imminent danger of the collapse of the wall and a broken beam that would have released further wreckage, they were unable to get any further. Private Brooks then dug through the remainder of the wreckage with his hands, reached the man and removed him uninjured. Throughout the latter portion of the rescue Private Brooks was in imminent danger of being buried and his action showed complete disregard for personal safety, and courage in undertaking a task that might have cost him his life. Throughout the morning of the 31st May, 1935, Private Brooks had been prominent in rescue work at Quetta Grammar School and in St. John's Road.

No. 985 Lance-Naik Chitrabahadur Gurung, 1st Battalion, 8th Gurkha Rifles, Indian Army.

This Non-commissioned Officer, along with other men, was instrumental in saving the life of Mrs. Newington (wife of Superintendent Newington of the Railway Police). The family of Mr. and Mrs. Newington were buried in the ruins of their bungalow some five or six feet under the debris. The party started digging at about 07:00 hours on 31st May, 1935. Through unceasing work carried out under very dangerous circumstances, as the work was carried out under the remaining wall of the bungalow, which would have fallen if another shock had taken place, the vicinity of the bodies was reached about 09:30 hours. Great care and intelligence were required in order to avoid wounding the couple, whilst speed was essential if there was to be any hope of rescue. Soon after 09:30 hours Mrs. Newington was extricated alive and shortly after Mr. Newington dead. Lance-Naik Chitrabahadur Gurung showed initiative, resource, and courage, which were undoubtedly instrumental in saving life.

No. 2022096 Private Ernest Mathew Elston, 1st Battalion, The West Yorkshire Regiment (The Prince of Wales' Own).

Private Elston worked with untiring energy at rescue work and in the subsequent salvage operations 31st May-14th June, 1935. He was personally responsible for saving the lives of several Indians buried under the debris in Quetta City; and on more than one occasion voluntarily endangered his own life to effect a rescue. On 31st May, 1935, in Quetta City regardless of his own safety, he worked at great personal risk for four hours to effect the rescue of an Indian child entombed alive under a collapsed double-storey building. In order to reach the child he had heard crying it was necessary to make a tunnel beneath the wreckage which was in a most unsafe condition. The dead bodies of other members of the family were encountered embedded in the debris; it was impracticable to extricate these, but the child was brought out unscathed. (The remains of this building did actually collapse in consequence of the shocks that took place during the night of 31st May-1st June, 1935.) Elston's personal example and bravery were most meritorious.

No. 6084408 Lance-Corporal George Henshaw, 1st Battalion, The Queen's Royal Regiment (West Surrey).

Immediately after the earthquake Private Henshaw, together with other military policemen, went to carry out rescue work at Quetta Grammar School. During this period he showed an utter disregard for his own safety and was most prominent in rescue operations in what was an extremely dangerous building. At 06.30 hours he was employed in rescue work in St. John's Road. An Indian child was located below wreckage above which was a considerable amount of debris liable to fall at any moment. Private Henshaw dug under the wreckage and at the risk of his life crawled under and dragged the child out alive. His courage throughout was of the highest order.

No. 1426460 Bombardier (Lance-Sergeant) Alfred Lungley, 24th Mountain Brigade, Royal Artillery.

In Bruce Road, Quetta, on 2nd June, 1935, at about 12.00 hours a survivor was located in a house on the east side of the road. In order to extricate the survivor it was necessary to go to the bottom of a deep hole surrounded and overhung by tottering masonry. This was liable to collapse at any minor shocks, some of which occurred during the work. Lance-Sergeant Lungley showed the greatest zeal and disregard for his own safety, although he was already suffering from a severe injury to his foot. The survivor was extricated alive.

No. 10081 Lance-Naik Mata Din, 4th Battalion, 19th Hyderabad Regiment, Indian Army.

On 31st May, 1935, this Non-commissioned Officer showed conspicuous devotion to duty by excavating a man who was buried in a very dangerous place (and for whose rescue three parties had already made attempts, but had left him there as there was very imminent danger of the working parties themselves being buried alive).

No. 7506 Naik Nandlal Thapa, 2nd Battalion, 8th Gurkha Rifles, Indian Army.

Naik Nandlal Thapa formed part of the leading detachment of the Battalion which was conveyed by Mechanical Transport from the Lines to Quetta City. There was no time for the party to collect tools. On arrival in the City the detachment was split up into small parties and worked with their hands for three hours, prior to the distribution of tools, extricating injured men and women from the debris. The area in which they worked was the junction of Bruce Road and Colvin Road, one of the parts most damaged by the earthquake. During this period minor shocks frequently occurred, causing further falls of masonry in the houses in which they were digging with their hands. Working with the party this Non-commissioned Officer showed conspicuous bravery in the manner in which he entered tottering buildings in search of living people and in the work and initiative he displayed in removing them. As a result of his disregard of danger ten people were rescued alive at considerable risk. He fully realised the

risks he ran, but was always ready to enter any building where there was any possibility of anybody remaining alive. His conduct was a very fine example of courage and energy at a critical time.
