**W**HEREAS by virtue of Section 10 of the Welsh Church Act, 1914, and the Orders in Council made thereunder, the powers of the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Wales were to continue until the end of the year 1919:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Welsh Church (Temporalities) Act, 1919, it was provided that His Majesty in Council might on the application of the said Commissioners suspend the dissolution of the said Commissioners and, subject to revision by the Treasury of the salaries of the said Commissioners, and the remuneration and number of their officers, continue their powers for such time as His Majesty thinks fit:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council made on the 20th day of December, 1919, under Section 1 of the said last recited Act, the dissolution of the said Commissioners was suspended, and their powers continued for a period of four years from the end of 1919:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council made on the 28th day of November, 1923, under Section 1 of the said last recited Act, the dissolution of the said Commissioners was further suspended, and their powers continued for a period of five years from the end of 1923:

And whereas by virtue of an Order in Council made on the 1st day of November,

1928, under Section 1 of the said last recited Act, the dissolution of the said Commissioners was further suspended, and their powers continued for a period of seven years from the end of 1928, and the said Commissioners would be dissolved at the end of the present year:

And whereas the said Commissioners have made an application that their dissolution may be suspended and their powers continued for a further period:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the dissolution of the said Commissioners shall be suspended and their powers shall (subject as aforesaid) be continued for a period of seven years from the end of the present year, and at the expiration of the said period the Commissioners shall be dissolved unless His Majesty in Council is pleased further to suspend their dissolution and continue their powers.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of

the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of the Good Shepherd, Collier Row, Romford, situate within the New Parish (sometime District) of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint John, Romford, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Romford, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of the Good Shepherd, Collier Row, Romford, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John, Romford, and with the consents of the Reverend Sydney Lawrence Brown, of Linden House, Brentwood, in the said County of Essex, of the Reverend William John Sparrow Simpson, of St. Mary's Hospital, Great Ilford, in the said County of Essex, of the Reverend Thomas Guy Steele, of The Ascension Clergy House, Victoria Docks, in the said County of Essex, all Clerks in Holy Orders and Honorary Canons of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, and of the Venerable Percy Matheson Bayne, of Number 107, Saint Andrew's Road, Great Ilford, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Southend, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Romford, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set

forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of the Good Shepherd, Collier Row, Romford, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of the Good Shepherd, Collier Row, Romford.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of the Good Shepherd, Collier Row, Romford, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District) of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint John, Romford, both in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which taken together are bounded upon the east by the Parish of Romford in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the south-west, upon the west, upon the north and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Romford from the said New Parish of Saint John, Romford, at the junction of Havering Road with Eastern Avenue and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Eastern Avenue for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the Bridge or culvert which carries Eastern Avenue across the River Rom and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the River Rom (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Romford, from the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford) for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Cross Road across the said River Rom and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Cross Road for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hulse Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Hulse Avenue for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Collier Row Lane and extending thence northward along the middle of Collier Row Lane for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading through the Lawns Recreation Ground into Havering Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Havering Road and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of 8 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Havering Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Ascension, Collier Row, Romford, from the said Parish of Romford."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every

part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Durham now vested in us:

"Whereas the property particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 7th day of November, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Bedminster and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Martin, Knowle, both in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Bedminster and the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Bedminster and of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister

shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Bedminster and of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Barnabas, Knowle.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other

measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Bedminster, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the west by the District Chapelry of Saint Dunstan, Bedminster, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Bishopsworth, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-east partly by the Parish of Whitchurch in the said County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells and partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington, in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, upon the east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Martin, Knowle, upon the north-east by the New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, both in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, from the said Parish of Bedminster, at the junction of Redcatch Road with Beckington Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Beckington Road and of the southern branch of Beckington Road for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the proposed footpath leading to Wedmore Vale, and extending thence first westward to and then first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said proposed footpath for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north-eastern side of Wedmore Vale near its junction with Glyn Vale, and extending thence first westward across Wedmore Vale to and then south-westward along the middle of Glyn Vale for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clonmel Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Clonmel Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lurgan Walk and Kildare Road, and extending thence westward to and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the roadway leading to the northern end of the site for the proposed Merrywood School for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the site for the said proposed school, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the walls or fences forming the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of such proposed school site for a distance in all of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of Nover's Common, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the walls or fences forming the south-eastern, southern, and south-western boundaries of Nover's Common for a distance in all of 14 chains or



thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the eastern side of Nover's Hill and extending thence westward in a straight line for a distance of 20 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Nover's Hill upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bedminster from the said District Chapelry of Saint Dunstan, Bedminster.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the east and upon the south by the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington, upon the west by the above described portion of the said Parish of Bedminster, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bedminster from the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, crosses the middle of Axbridge Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Axbridge Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Salcombe Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Salcombe Road for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 3rd October, 1935, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 14th day of November next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Cranbrook save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

**CRANBROOK.**—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Dunstons', in the said Parish, and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) in the walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to the Atkin-Roberts family, the burial may be allowed of the body of Malcolm Roberts Atkin-Roberts at his decease subject to the condition that the coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented;

(b) in earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burials may be allowed at their decease of the following relations of those already interred therein—Catherine Anne Horsley, Anne Potten, Isabella Sutherland, William Evenden, Kate Mackenzie, Emily Jessie Huntley, Harry Seward Baker, Louisa Elizabeth Dell, Emma Sarah Bartholomew Grieg, Amelia Gertrude Hardy, John Jones, Katherine Alice Wood, Jemima Jenner, Esther Jane Dobell, Walter Moore, Mary Beech, Horace Walter French, Elizabeth Taylor, Harriet Annie Horn, Sarah Ann Towner, Frederick Wright Neve and Florence Jane Neve, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in any case be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

ASHBURY.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, in the said Parish, and in the Old Churchyard attached thereto.

In the vault now existing in the said Churchyard and belonging or reputed to belong to the Brown family, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Harold Pearce Brown, John Pearce Brown, Frank Pearce Brown and Alexander Pearce Brown subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Pursuant to paragraph 5 of the Regulations dated the 26th day of October, 1932, for the Drawing of Three per cent. Treasury Bonds the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that the Fourth and Final Drawing of these Bonds will take place on Tuesday, the 3rd December, 1935, and succeeding days. The nominal amount of the Bonds to be drawn will be forty per cent., being the whole amount outstanding, of the total nominal amount of the Bonds originally created.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th November, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd December, 1935, to Saturday, the 7th December, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
