The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge, on the 15th day of November, 1935, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES OF CORPUS CHRISTI COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, WHICH AMENDING STATUTE, HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE, SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THE PURPOSE AND HELD ON THE 15TH NOVEMBER, 1935, AND PASSED AT SUCH MEETING BY THE VOTES OF NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS OF THE NUMBER OF PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING, AND NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AMENDING STATUTE HAVING BEEN GIVEN TO THE UNIVERSITY, IS NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, the Master and Fellows of Corpus Christi College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power

given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College by amending Section D of Statute 9 so as to read as follows:—

Any person who has held a Fellowship under Section A or C for twenty years in all and vacates such Fellowship by resignation or superannuation shall hold a Fellowship under this section for life; any person who has held a Fellowship under any section or sections for fifteen years in all may be elected a Fellow under this section and if so elected shall hold his Fellowship for life; and any person who has held a Fellowship under Section C as holding a Professorship or other University Office which rendered him ineligible under the Statutes of the University to hold a Fellowship with dividend may be elected a Fellow under this section and if so elected shall hold his Fellowship for life; provided always that except in such cases and in so far as the Master and Fellows may otherwise determine by a vote in which not less than two-thirds of those present concur, Fellows who hold Fellowships under this section shall be entitled to vote as Fellows of the College only in respect of changes in the statutes of the College, and save in respect of such changes shall not be counted in reckoning any necessary majority.

Fellows holding their Fellowship under this section shall receive no dividend.

In witness whereof we, the said Master and Fellows of Corpus Christi College have hereto caused our Common Seal to be affixed this 26th day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th December, 1935, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th December, 1935, to Saturday, the 14th December, 1935, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

CIVIL SERVICE.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS dated the 23rd November, 1935, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1920, with respect to the sick leave pay to be allowed to Civil Servants to whom the provisions of Article 19 of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910, formerly applied.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of 22nd July, 1920, the Treasury hereby make the following Regulations supplementary to the Regulations of 6th June, 1929, made by them under that Article of that Order and referred to hereafter as the principal Regulations.

1. When the limit referred to in Clause 1 (i) (d) of the principal Regulations has been reached owing largely to sick leave due to an injury in respect of which an annual allowance could, on the retirement of the officer, be awarded under the appropriate Injury Warrant framed by the Treasury under section 1 of the Superannuation Act, 1887, or section 1 of that Act as amended by section 11 of the Superannuation Act, 1935, the Treasury may, if they think fit, allow in respect of subsequent sick leave, and in addition to the pay (if any) allowed under Clause 1 (ii) of the principal Regulations, pay at a rate not exceeding the amount of the annual allowance which could have been awarded under such Injury Warrant if the officer had retired at the expiration of twelve months' sick leave.

Provided that the total pay allowed under this Clause and Clause 1 (ii) of the principal Regulations shall not in any case exceed half pay, and that, in respect of sick leave due to ordinary illness, pay shall not be allowed under this Clause for a period longer than the period of the sick leave due to the injury which had been allowed up to the date of the expiration of twelve months' sick leave.

2. The following provisions shall apply in the case of officers who have been allowed sick pay inclusive of compensation under any Act relating to Workmen's compensation for the time being in force in Great Britain, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man or the Irish Free State or of compensation or hurt pay under any Scheme framed under any such Act:—

(i) Where, in respect of subsequent sick leave due to ordinary illness, half pay would

be allowable under Clause 1 (i) (c) of the principal Regulations, pay may be allowed at a rate not exceeding the appropriate amount of compensation or hurt pay, if greater than half pay, for a period not longer than that for which sick pay inclusive of compensation or hurt pay was allowed.

(ii) When the limit referred to in Clause 1 (i) (d) of the principal Regulations has been reached half pay or pay at a rate not exceeding the appropriate amount of compensation or hurt pay, whichever is the less, may be allowed, during any further sick leave due to ordinary illness, for a period not longer than that for which sick pay inclusive of compensation or hurt pay was allowed.

3. Sick leave in excess of the limit referred to in Clause 1 (i) (d) of the principal Regulations which is allowed under these Regulations shall not be reckoned for the purposes of increment or pension unless the Treasury otherwise direct.

4. These Regulations shall come into force, in regard to Clause 1, with effect from the 1st day of November, 1935, and in regard to Clause 2, with effect from the 1st day of February, 1929.

COUNTY OF MONMOUTH.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the Alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas on the first day of January, 1935, a vacancy occurred in the office of Franchise Coroner of the Manor of Chepstow in the County of Monmouth:

And whereas by the operation of section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the area in which the said Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction thereupon, for all purposes relating to Coroners, became merged in the said County:

And whereas by section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that where any area in which a Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into Coroners' Districts, any consequential alteration of the division of the County into Coroners' Districts shall be effected in manner provided by the Act:

And whereas it is provided by section 12 of the said Act that a County Council may at any time submit, after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of objections as may be prescribed, to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the County into Coroners' Districts, as appears to them to be suitable, and that the Secretary of State, after taking into consideration any objections to the draft made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an Order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas the said County is now divided into four Coroners' Districts:

And whereas the Council of the said County has in pursuance of the said section 12 of the said Act submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order to the aforesaid intent:

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore I the undersigned one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the said Act hereby Order that the existing division of the County of Monmouth into Coroners' Districts shall be altered and that the said Districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule to this Order and substituted for the existing Districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the second day of December, 1935; provided however that nothing herein contained shall affect the proceedings at any inquest begun by a Coroner before that day.
