REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE Examinations for the situation of Carto-GRAPHER IN THE HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

Competitions under these Regulations are open to candidates of either sex. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. candidate who attained the age of 19 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 25 on that day would not be admitted.
