The following Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 26th day of November, 1935, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 26 NOVEMBER, 1935.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Statutes of the University of Oxford in order to provide (a) for the permanent continuance of the Montague Burton Professorship of International Relations; (b) that the University shall have power to make exceptions to the provision that the emoluments of a Professorship during a vacancy or period of suspension shall be paid to the Common University Fund; (c) that the University shall have power to add new Professorships to the Schedule of Professorial stipends.

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 3, Schedule A (Statuta, ed. 1935, p. 58, l. 41)*, after "Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions" insert "Montague Burton Professor of International Relations".

2. *Ibid. Sect. II, H (p. 120, l. 10)*, delete § 15 and substitute the following new Sub-section:

"§ 15. *Montague Burton Professor of International Relations.*

1. The income of the endowment to be received by the University from Sir Montague Burton on the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council shall be applied to the maintenance of a Professorship to be called the 'Montague Burton Professorship of International Relations' and to the payment of the University share of the contribution in respect of the Professor to the Federated Superannuation Scheme; provided always that the stipend of the Professor shall not exceed £1,200 a year.

2. Any excess of income, whether arising from vacancies or otherwise, shall be reserved for maintaining the annual income of the endowment at £1,320 until, in the opinion of the Hebdomadal Council, the excess of income so reserved is sufficient for the purpose; thereupon further excess of income arising otherwise than from vacancies may be devoted to other purposes connected with the study of international relations, provided always that such further excess of income shall not be devoted to other purposes unless the Professorship shall have first been added to the Schedule annexed to *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 4*.

3. If in any year, whether owing to a vacancy in the Professorship, or any other cause whatever, the whole or any part of the income of the Trust Funds for that year shall not be applied for the purposes specified in clause 2 hereof, or if in any year there shall be a surplus of income after providing for the purposes

specified in such clause, then such unapplied income and surplus income shall at the absolute discretion of the University be applied or dealt with in all or any of the following ways:

(a) be carried forward to form a separate fund to be utilized to pay the Professor's travelling expenses to Geneva so as to enable him to keep in touch with the activities of the League of Nations;

(b) be carried forward to supplement the income of the Trust Fund in the next or any subsequent year or years;

(c) be applied for the purposes of establishing a scholarship or scholarships, or student-ship or studentships, or exhibition or exhibitions, or prize or prizes in the same subjects as those for which the said Professorship is endowed. Such scholarship or scholarships, studentship or studentships, exhibition or exhibitions, prize or prizes, shall be awarded to such person or persons, and be held for such period or periods and upon such conditions as the University shall in its absolute discretion from time to time determine;

(d) be added to the capital of the Trust Fund and invested in such securities and with the like powers as are authorized for the investment of the Trust Fund.

4. The Professor shall lecture and give instruction on the theory of International Relations and on methods of international co-operation with particular reference to the work and aims of the League of Nations.

5. The Professor shall be elected by an Electoral Board consisting of

(1) the Vice-Chancellor, or, if the Master of Balliol College is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion;

(2) the Master of Balliol College, or, if he is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the Master and Fellows of Balliol College on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion;

(3) George Gilbert Aimé Murray, M.A., D.Litt., Student of Christ Church, for such time, subject to the provisions of *Statt. Tit. XII. Sect. I. § 1, cl. 7*, as he shall please to remain an Elector, and thereafter a person appointed by the Master and Fellows of Balliol College;

(4) The Right Honourable the Viscount Cecil of Chelwood, M.A., Hon. D.C.L., Hon. Fellow of University College, for such time, subject to the provisions of *Statt. Tit. XII. Sect. I. § 1, cl. 7*, as he shall please to remain an Elector, and thereafter a person appointed by the Hebdomadal Council;

(5), (6) two persons elected by the Board of the Faculty of Social Studies;

(7) a person elected by the Board of the Faculty of Modern History.

6. The Professor shall be subject to the General Regulations of the Statute concerning the Duties of Professors and to those Particular Regulations of the same Statute which are applicable to his Chair."

3. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. III. § 2, Schedule (Statuta, ed. 1935, p. 133)*, after "International Law and Diplomacy, Chichele" in the Professors and Readers enumerated under Social Studies, insert "International Relations, Montague Burton".

4. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 2 (a), cl. 5 (Statuta, ed. 1935, p. 50, l. 5)*, after "Fund" add "unless the University shall otherwise determine by Statute or Decree".

5. *Ibid. § 4, cl. 1 (p. 60, l. 12)*, after "Schedule" add "In the event of any new Professorship being established by Statute, the University shall have power by Statute to add it and its emoluments to the Schedule".

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE AS MALE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF TRAFFIC (CLASS II) IN THE LONDON TELEPHONE SERVICE, AND MALE ASSISTANT TRAFFIC SUPERINTENDENT IN THE PROVINCES.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this Examination are 18 and 23. In reckoning age, candidates who have served, or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the son of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. English Composition.
2. General Knowledge.

3. Lower Mathematics.
4. Electricity.
5. *Either* Higher Mathematics or Telephony.
6. *Either* Mechanics or Electrotechnology or Telegraphy.
7. Personal Qualities.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in subjects 1 to 6 taken together as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners; and they must also pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in subject 7.

The Examination may be held in two parts at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In this case the first part of the Examination, viz., subjects 1 to 6 inclusive, will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part, viz., subject 7. Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the Examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks in the whole Examination.

6. Any attempt, direct or indirect, on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through influential persons will disqualify him for appointment.

7. Applications for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

8. A fee of £1 will be required from every applicant for permission to attend an Examination; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £3 5s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £4 5s., will be required from every candidate attending such Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 28th April, 1936.
