BRIGHTON CORPORATION.

APPPLICATION has been made to Parliament in the present Session by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton for a Bill with the above mentioned short title and intituled "A Bill to confer powers upon the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Brighton of running trolley vehicles; to authorise them to purchase lands and exercise powers for the prevention of contamination of their water supply; to confer further powers upon them in relation to their water undertaking and other matters; to make better provision for the health local government and finance of the borough; and for other purposes".

A Notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the Bill has been published in the Sussex Daily News of the 2nd and 9th December, 1935.
