POST OFFICE (SITES).

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present session by the Postmaster General for an Act under the above name or short title intituled "A Bill to enable the Postmaster General to acquire lands in London for the purpose of the Post Office and for the purpose of executing certain street work in the metropolitan borough of St. Pancras and to acquire lands in Manchester and Hereford for the purpose of the Post Office, and for purposes connected with the matters aforesaid."

A Notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the intended Act has been published in full in "The Times" of the 26th day of November and the 3rd day of December, 1935.

And Notice is hereby also given that plans and a Section showing the lands which may

HERRING INDUSTRY SCHEME, 1935.

THE Herring Industry Board hereby give notice that on the 21st day of November, 1935, in the exercise of their powers under the Herring Industry Scheme, 1935, they revoked, as from the 31st day of December, 1935, the Rules made by them on the 5th day of June, the 6th day of August and the 9th day of October, 1935, and made other Rules to take effect on the 1st day of January, 1936, prescribing:—(i) the date from which licences must be obtained for certain classes of boats and by salesmen, curers, kipperers and exporters; the form of such licences, and of applications therefor; (ii) the amount of the levy to be paid on herring sold or disposed of without sale; (iii) the amount of exporters' commission; (iv) that a receipt is required to be given to salesmen by purchasers of fresh herring at first sales.

Copies of the said Rules dated the 21st day of November, 1935, may be obtained on application from the British Herring Trade Association (address 18, Golden Square, Aberdeen); the Scottish Herring Producers' Association (address 14, Bon Accord Square, Aberdeen) and the English Herring Catchers' Association (address Ocean View, 28, Suffolk Road, Lowestoft) or from any Fishery Officer of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries and Fishery Board for Scotland, or from the Herring Industry Board, 8, Buckingham Gate, London, S.W.1.
