

In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.

In the Matter of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907-1932, and in the Matter of Letters Patent 142,051, dated the 24th day of November, 1919, and granted to JOHN RUDOLPH KINGSTON, of Fern Bank, Colney Hatch Lane, Muswell Hill, London, N.10, for an invention of improvements in or relating to combustion-product engines.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is the intention of Continuous Combustion Oil Engines Limited and the above named John Rudolph Kingston to present a petition to the High Court of Justice praying that the term of the said Letters Patent may be extended. And notice is further given that on the fifteenth day of January, 1936, at 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon, or so soon thereafter as Counsel may be heard, the said Continuous Combustion Oil Engines Limited and John Rudolph Kingston intend to apply to the Court for a day to be fixed before which the petition shall not be in the paper for hearing. In the Matter of BLAKE'S (TEXTILES) Limited, and in the Matter of the Companies Act, 1929.

UPON the petition of the above named Blake's (Textiles) Limited, whose registered office is situate at 27, Great Castle Street, Oxford Circus, in the county of London, by Lloyd Owen Morris, of 79, Salisbury House, London Wall, in the city of London, its Liquidator in the voluntary winding-up thereof on the 1st November, 1935, preferred unto this Court; and upon hearing Counsel for the Petitioner and for Bass Collier & Co. Limited (in Liquidation), a creditor of the above named Company, opposing the said petition, and upon reading the said petition, the affidavit of Lloyd Owen Morris, filed the 5th November, 1935 (verifying the said petition), the London Gazette and the Daily Telegraph newspaper both dated the 5th November, 1935 (each containing an advertisement of the said petition), the London Gazette dated the 12th November, 1935, containing a notice of the passing of the Special Resolution for the voluntary winding-up of the said Company and for the appointment of the said Lloyd Owen Morris as Liquidator thereof, the affidavit of John Sinclair Carswell filed the 15th November, 1935, the affidavit of Markham Henry Thorp, the affidavit of Lloyd Owen Morris and the affidavit of James Young Broughton, all filed the 22nd November, 1935.

This Court doth Order that the voluntary winding-up of the said Blake's (Textiles) Limited be continued but subject to the supervision of this Court and any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding-up may be adopted as the Court shall think fit.

And the said Lloyd Owen Morris by his Counsel expressing his willingness to retire from his office as Liquidator of the said Company and retiring accordingly, it is ordered that the said Lloyd

Owen Morris be and he is hereby re-appointed Liquidator of the said Blake's (Textiles) Limited.

And it is ordered that the said Lloyd Owen Morris or other the Liquidator for the time being of the said Company, do every three months file with the Registrar, Companies Court, a report in writing as to the position of and the progress made with the winding-up of the said Company and with the realisation of the assets thereof, and as to any other matters connected with the winding-up as the Court may from time to time direct, the first of such reports be filed on the 25th February, 1936.

And it is ordered that the Liquidator do summon a Meeting of the creditors of the said Company (if any) within one month from the date of this Order and at the end of each succeeding year, and that he do lay before such Meeting an account of his acts and dealings and of the conduct of the winding-up of the said Company, the account to be laid before the first of such Meetings to be for the period from the 28th October, 1935, to the date of such Meeting, and subsequent accounts to be for the year preceding the date on which the Meeting is held.

And it is ordered that the creditors at the first Meeting to be held pursuant to this Order may, if they think fit, appoint an Advisory Committee or a Committee of Inspection.

And it is ordered that on summoning the General Meeting of the Company pursuant to section 236 of the above mentioned Act the Liquidator do also summon a Meeting of the creditors (if any) for the same day, and that he do lay before such Meeting the account required by the said section, to be laid before the General Meeting of the Company under such section and give any explanation thereof.

And it is ordered that no Bills of Costs charges or expenses or special remuneration of any Solicitor employed by the Liquidator of the said Company, or any remuneration charges or expenses of such Liquidator or of any Manager, Accountant, Auctioneer, Broker or other person be paid out of the assets of the said Company unless such costs charges, expenses or remuneration shall have been taxed or allowed by the said Registrar, Companies Court.

And it is ordered that all such costs charges, expenses and remuneration be taxed and ascertained accordingly.

And it is ordered that the costs of the said Company and of the said Bass Collier & Co. Limited of the said petition be taxed and paid out of the assets of the said Company.

And the creditors, contributories and Liquidator of the said Company and all other persons interested are to be at liberty to apply as there may be occasion.

And the time for the advertisement of this Order in the London Gazette is hereby extended to the 13th December, 1935.

And this Order is without prejudice to the right of the said Bass Collier & Co. Limited to present a petition for the winding-up of the said Company by the Court.
