The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF MALE MAP CONSTRUCTOR APPRENTICE (NON-ESTABLISHED) IN THE MAPPING SECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY OPERATIONS AND INTELLIGENCE OF THE WAR OFFICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 16 and must not have attained the age of 17 on the first March of the year in which the examination is held.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the War Office is required before a candidate either of

whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth can be appointed to that Department.

3. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The subjects of examination and the marks they carry are as follows:—

(1) English	...	...	...	200

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Drawing and in the examination as a whole.

5. Examinations will, when required, be held concurrently with the open competitive examination for appointments in the Clerical Classes (General and Departmental) of the Civil Service, and candidates may compete simultaneously at both examinations provided they are eligible in all respects.

6. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. A fee of 15s. will be required from each candidate attending an examination; provided that a candidate who is also attending a concurrent examination for appointment to the Clerical Classes (General and Departmental) will not be required to pay a further fee in addition to the fee payable in respect of that examination.

8. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on a non-established and temporary basis, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character.

9. On completion of 5 years' training Map Constructor Apprentices will be eligible for appointment to the established grade of Second Class Map Constructor. Appointment to the established grade is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a certificate of qualification; a fee of 15s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £1 10s., is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued, provided that this further fee will not be required in the case of a candidate who, when attending the open competitive examination, was a candidate also at a concurrent examination for appointment to the Clerical Classes (General and Departmental) and paid the full fee prescribed in respect of that examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 19th May, 1936. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Darlington, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Preston, Sheffield, Stoke-on-Trent, Swansea, and Workington.
