The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Wadham College, in the University of Oxford, on the 20th day of November, 1935, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published

in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

WADHAM COLLEGE, OXFORD.

Statute to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, 13 and 14 George V. cap. 33, and approved by the King in Council in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford in the matter of Dr. Hody's Scholarships within the College, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twentieth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

For Statute VIII, Clause 1, substitute the following Clause:—

1. Instead of the Exhibitions founded by Dr. Hody for the encouragement of the study of Hebrew and Greek, there shall be three Scholarships in the College, to be called the Hody Scholarships.

The Elections to two of the three Hody Scholarships shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be after examination in the Hebrew Language and Literature, if candidates sufficiently qualified in those subjects (who shall satisfy the College that they are otherwise fit to be members of the College, shall present themselves. The competition for such two Hebrew Scholarships shall be open to all candidates, whether members of either

of the Universities of Oxford or Cambridge or not, whose age on the day of election

shall not exceed twenty years.

In case of there being no candidate for a Hebrew Scholarship who in the judgment of the Governing Body is of sufficient merit for election to a Scholarship, the Governing Body may, if they think fit, award to an unsuccessful competitor whom they may deem deserving of it, an Exhibition to be held on the same tenure and subject to the same conditions as the Hody Hebrew Scholarships and to be of a value not exceeding £60 a year.

Every person elected to either of the said two Scholarships or to the said Exhibition in lieu thereof shall be bound (if the Governing Body shall think fit so to require) to give continued attention to the study of Hebrew during all, or such part as the Governing Body shall think fit, of the time during which he shall continue to hold his Scholarship or Exhibition.

The emoluments of each of the said Hebrew Scholarships shall be £80 per annum, inclusive of rooms and all other allowances; and all persons elected thereto shall hold their Scholarships in the same manner, and subject to the same conditions and regulations as to duration, tenure, and otherwise, in all respects as if they had been Foundation Scholars, elected under Statute III.

In the case of there being no candidate for a Hebrew Scholarship who in the judgment of the Governing Body is of sufficient merit for election to a Scholarship or deserving of the award of an Exhibition as aforesaid, the Governing Body may, if they think fit, postpone the election for a period not exceeding one year, at which postponed election the Governing Body may, at their discretion, offer the vaca either for Hebrew or Greek. vacant Scholarship

The election to the other Hody Scholarship and the postponed election to any Hebrew Scholarship which the Governing Body may have determined to offer for Greek shall be made at the same time, and by the same Electoral Board, and generally under the same conditions, in the same manner, and with the same emoluments as the elections to Open Scholarships under Statute III; save only that, in such election, special regard shall be had to proficiency in the Greek Language and Literature.

The residue of the income of Dr. Hody's Fund, if any shall remain (including emoluments accrued during the vacancy of any Scholarship), shall be allowed to accumulate. The Fund thus provided, as well the capital as the income thereof, may be applied by the Governing Body for any purpose connected with the study of Greek or Hebrew. The cost of all repairs on Dr. Hody's estates shall be paid for out of the corporate revenue of the College.

The Common Seal of the said College was hereunto affixed on the thirteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th December, 1935, to Saturday, the 4th January, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

SCHEDULE.

An Area of approximately 173 square miles situated in the Counties of Wilts, Berks and Southampton.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the cross-roads at the junction of Salisbury Road, George Lane and London Road, in the town of Marlborough situated in the County of Wilts, thence in an easterly direction along London Road past Forest Hill and through Froxfield to the branch road situated about 1,800 feet east of Somerset Hospital. Thence in a southerly direction along the branch road crossing the Great Western Railway and the Kennet and Avon Canal to Frith Copse, thence along the road in a southeasterly direction to the north end of Stype Wood, thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction to the town of Hungerford, situated in the county of Berks, passing through that town by way of Church Street and Park Street to Down Gate, thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction and in an easterly direction along the foot-path over Hungerford Port Down and along the road past Inteaze Farm to the town of Kintbury, passing through Kintbury by way of High Street and Newbury Street. Thence along the road in a south-easterly direction past Hamstead Holt Farm, to the junction of roads about 1,800 feet south of Holt Manor Farm. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction for a distance of about 1,800 feet to the junction of roads, thence along the road in a south-easterly

direction to Ball Hill, thence in an easterly direction to the junction of roads situated about 600 feet south-west of Bourne House and about 3,250 feet west of Woodhay Station on the Great Western Railway.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the road in a southerly direction past Elm Farm and to the east of Broad Laying to the junction of roads about 1,000 feet west of Milking Bridge. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction crossing Milking Bridge to its junction with the main Newbury-Andover Road. Thence along the said main road in a southerly direction past Highelere to the Three-Legged Cross Inn. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction through Hurstbourne Tarrant and Knights Enham to the junction of Bridge Street High Street and London Street in the town of Andover, situated in the county of South-ampton.

Thence in a westerly direction along Bridge Street and Weyhill Road to Hundred Acre Corner, thence in a north-westerly direction past Weyhill to Ludgershall in the county of Wilts, passing through that town by way of Winchester Street, St. James Street and Butt Street, thence along the main road in a north-westerly direction to Everley and thence in a westerly direction past Lower Everley to Rowden's Cleeve. Thence in a northerly direction to Upavon Bridge in the town of Upavon.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road in a westerly direction through Upavon to the cross-roads situated about 1,750 feet west of St. Mary's Church in the town of Upavon. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the road through Rushall and in a north-easterly direction over Wood Bridge to the smithy at Manningford Bruce. Northern Boundary.

Commencing at a point on the main road from Farnham to Basingstoke near Bowling Alley at the junction of Hyde Lane and about 4,600 feet north of All Saints' Church in the village of Crondall, thence along the main road in a westerly direction through the town of Odiham by way of Farnham Road and High Street and along the road in a north-westerly direction past North Warnborough, Hook Common and Nately Scures to the town of Basingstoke. Thence through Basingstoke by way of London Road, Eastrop Bridge, Basing Road, Chapel Street and Chapel Hill, continuing in a north-westerly direction along the road past Shothanger Farm to the town of Kingsclere, passing through this town by way of George Street thence past Field Gate Farm and continuing along the road in a westerly direction past Nothing Hill and Duncroft

Thence in a southerly and south-westerly direction along the Newbury-Andover road, through the village of Hurstbourne Tarrant and Knights Enham to the junction of High Street, Bridge Street and London Street in the town of Andover.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in an easterly direction along London Street and along the main road past Andover Down to the town of Whitchurch, passing through Whitchurch by way of Church Street, thence in a southerly direction along Winchester Street to a point 250 feet south of Poplar Terrace, thence in a south-easterly direction along the road past Knowle Farm and Cranbourne Wood to Micheldever Station, crossing the Southern Railway main line by Northbrook Farm and continuing along the road in an easterly and south-easterly direction past Larkwhistle Farm to the main Basing-stoke-Winchester road. Thence along the road in a north-easterly direction to London Lodge. Thence along the branch road in an easterly and north-easterly direction to Woodmancott following the road skirting College Wood, past Breach Farm to the junction of roads about 2,000 feet to the north-east of Breach Farm. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of about 1,200 feet, thence following the foot-path in the same direction through Upper Barn Wood, past Upper Barn to Preston House Home Farm at Preston Candover. Thence along the road running in an easterly and north-easterly direction past Bradley Hill to the cross-roads near Preston Oak Hills. Thence in a southeasterly direction past Down Wood, Wadgett's Copse and Warren Farm to the town of Alton, passing through Alton by way of Lenten Street, Market Street, Normandy Street and Anstey Road, thence in a north-easterly direction through the villages of Anstey and Holybourne to Cuckoo's Corner. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction past Stean Farm, West Court, through the village of Binstead and past River Hill Farm to the cross-roads at Blacknest.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a northerly direction along the road crossing the Southern Railway at Isington, through the village of Bentley, past Bury Court, Glade Farm, Montgomery's Farm and Itchel Manor House to the cross-roads at Bowling Alley, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 177 square miles situated in the Counties of Wilts, Dorset and Southampton.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing from the village of Mottisfont in the county of Southampton at a point

situated in the road opposite the Rectory, thence in a westerly direction along Hatt Lane to Hatt Farm, and along the road in a southerly direction to the Mill Arms Inn at Dunbridge Station, thence along the road in a westerly direction past Lockerley, Butts Green, Lockerley Green, East Dean, West Dean and Manor Farm to the cross-roads near Butter Furlong Farm, thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction crossing the Southern Railway at West Grimstead, past Crockford Copse to the junction of roads near Whaddon, thence in a north-westerly direction past Whaddon Common and following the main Salisbury road past Alderbury and Peter's Finger to the city of Salisbury in the county of Wilts, passing through the outskirts of Salisbury by way of Southampton Road, St. Anne's Street, Brickett's Hospital, St. Elizabeth's School, St. Nicholas Road and Coombe Road. Thence along the road past East Harnham and along the road running in a south-westerly direction to the Inn at Coombe Bissett. Thence along the road running in a westerly and south-westerly direction past Stratford Tony and Bishopstone, through Broad Chalke, Ebbesbourne Wake and Berwick St. John to a point in the road about 150 feet east of Ferne Park Lodge and about 1,500 feet north-east of Ferne House.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a southerly direction along the parish boundary through Ferne Park and along the road through Ferne Hollow and in an easterly direction over Monks Down to the fork-roads about 3,500 feet west of Higher Bridmore Farm. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction over Cranbourne Chase along the forest road to Deanend. Thence along the road in an easterly direction past New Barn, Handley Village and Frogmore Farm to the junction of roads about 300 feet north of Manor Farm. Thence along the road in an easterly direction to the cross-roads at Handley Hill. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction over Bottlebush Down to the junction of roads by Creech Hill Farm.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road in an easterly direction to Dead Man and in a northerly direction for a distance of about 1,100 feet to the crossroads in the village of Cranborne. Thence along the road in a south-easterly direction past Holwell Farm, Cripplestyle and Daggons to Charing Cross. Thence in a north-easterly direction along Park Bottom Road, through the village of Alderholt and past Bonfire Hill to Fordingbridge, passing through Fordingbridge by way of Frog Lane, Church Street, Provost Street, High Street and Bridge Street, thence along the road in an easterly direction past Criddlestyle, Godshill, Deadman Hill, Crow's Nest Bottom, Brook, Cadnam and Netley Marsh to the junction of Ringwood Road and Salisbury Road in the town of Totton, situated in the county of Southampton.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along Salisbury Road in a northwesterly direction through Testwood to the road junction by Wade Park Farm, thence in a north-easterly direction over Blackwater Bridge to the town of Romsey, passing through Romsey by way of Middlebridge Street, Bell Street, Church Street and Cherville Street, thence in a northerly direction along the road through Timsbury to Mottisfont, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 178 square miles situated in the County of Southampton.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing from the junction of the main Alton-Fareham road and the New Alresford situated approximately a mile north-west of the village of Colemore, thence along the road in a north-westerly direction past Winchester Wood and in a westerly direction past Lyeway through Ropley and Bishop's Sutton to New Alresford, passing through the latter by way of East and West Streets, Pound Hill and The Avenue to the junction of roads situated 700 feet south-west of the point where the road under the Southern Railway by Seward's Bridge. Thence along the road in a north-westerly and westerly direction through Itchen Stoke and Itchen Abbas to King's Worthy, past St. Mary's Church, Southcroft and the Manor House, thence in a north-westerly direction past Headbourne Worthy, Littleton House and Folly Barn to the cross-roads in the village of Charley. roads in the village of Crawley. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction past the Rack and Manger Inn, and Little Somborne to the junction of roads by the Crown Inn in the village of King's Somborne.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction past Compton Park, Brook and Stoneymarsh, and in a south-easterly and southerly direction past Timsbury, through the town of Romsey by way of Cherville Street, Church Road, Bell Street and Middlebridge Street, thence in a south-westerly direction along the road past Pauncefoot, Cutters Barn, crossing the River Blackwater at Blackwater Bridge, thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction past Brooke's Hill to the junction of Commercial Road and Junction Road in the town of Totton.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in an easterly direction through Totton and Redbridge to the junction of roads at Millbrook. Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past Wimpson and Old Shirley, passing through the outskirts of Southampton by way of Winchester Road, Burgess Road, Langhorn Road, Church Lane and Station Road, passing under the Southern Railway at High Road. Thence in a northeasterly direction alongside the Southern Railway to Wide Lane bridge and continuing in a north-easterly direction through the town of Eastleigh by way of Southampton Road to the junction of Bishopstoke Road. Thence in an easterly direction along Bishopstoke Road and Fairoak Road, through the village of Fair Oak, past Fair Oak Park and Mortimers Farm to the cross-roads at Lower Upham. Thence in a southwesterly direction along Derby Road and Weydown Road and in a westerly direction past Shottermill, thence in a north-westerly direction past Wolmer Hill and Pitfold House to the main Godalming-Petersfield road by Chase Villas. Thence in a south-westerly direction along the said main road over Bramshott Common to Cold Ash Hill, thence in a northwesterly direction to the village of Bramshott in the county of Southampton, passing through Bramshott by way of St. Mary's Church, Covar's Farm and Bramshott Mill, thence in a westerly direction along the road past the Mill House, crossing the River Way and in a north-westerly direction over Passfield Common to the road junction at Eveley House by the Ford at Standford. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction past the smithy and Hollywater, thence in a westerly direction past White Hill, and in a south-westerly direction past Blackmoor, Snap Wood, Brockbridge Farm and Bradshott Hall and in a north-westerly direction to the fork-roads by Ketcher's Farm near Selborne. Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction along Galley Hill past Selborne Common, Lower Noar Hill Farm and Old Place Farm to the cross-roads in the village of East Tisted.

Thence along the main Midhurst Road in a north-westerly direction past Oldhouse Farm, Cocking Park and West Lavington to the road junction near Balls Farm, thence in a westerly direction along the road past Great Todham Farm, and South Ambersham to the cross-roads at Selham. Thence in a northerly direction along the road crossing the River Rother by Lods Bridge to Beggars' Corner situated by the mill at Halfway Bridge, thence in an easterly direction along the road past White House, Little Common and Tillington to Petworth, passing through Petworth by way of Pound Street, Park Road, Church Street, East Street and Angel Street.

Thence in a south-easterly direction along the road past Byworth, Low Heath, Egdean, through Fittleworth and past Stopham and Coldharbour to the cross-roads in the village of Pulborough.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along London Road in a northeasterly direction past Codmore Hill and along Stane Street to Billingshurst, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 166 square miles situated in the County of Sussex.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing from the road junction about 250 feet south of St. Mary's Church in the village of Fittleworth, thence along the road

Commencing at the junction of Church Road and London Road in the town of Burgess Hill, thence in an easterly and southerly direction through the town by way of Church Road, past the Southern Railway Station, Oak Hall and in an easterly direction along Folders Lane past Folders and Ditchling Common to the road junction at Blackbrook Wood, thence in an easterly direction along the road passing to the north of Gallops Farm to the cross-roads near St. Helena Farm. Thence in a southeasterly direction along the road to the junction of roads near Homewoodgate Farm, thence in an easterly direction to the junction of roads by the Hospital near Chailey Potteries. Thence along the main road in a south-easterly direction past Bevern Bridge and Winterlands Farm to the fork roads by the Rainbow Inn near Conyboro. Thence along the road in a northerly direction past Conyboro and Folly Farm to the road junction by Gallybird Hall, and along the road in an easterly direction past Handly Farm crossing the Southern Railway by Barcombe Station to the road junction at Barcombe Cross. Thence along the road in a south-easterly direction crossing the Southern Railway by Barcombe Mills Station and Barcombe House to the main Lewes-Uckfield Road. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction past Cock Inn and in a south-easterly direction past Ham Farm to the road junction situated about 1,000 feet south of St. Mary's Church in the village of Ringmer. Thence in a north-easterly direction through Ringmer to the fork roads near Ringmer Kennels, thence along the road running in an easterly direction past the Railway Inn, Brayle Place, through Laughton past Stone Cross and Broomham to the cross-roads at Golden Cross. Thence along the road in a south-easterly direction past Lower Dicker, Knights Farm through Lower Horsebridge and Upper Horsebridge to the cross-roads near the Water Works at Amber-Thence in an easterly and northeasterly direction along the road through Magham Down past Upper House, through Gardner Street, thence in a south-easterly direction past Windmill Hill through Boreham Street, and in a north-easterly direction past Hazard's Green to Standard Hill. ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.
