

direction to Ball Hill, thence in an easterly direction to the junction of roads situated about 600 feet south-west of Bourne House and about 3,250 feet west of Woodhay Station on the Great Western Railway.

*Eastern Boundary.*

Thence along the road in a southerly direction past Elm Farm and to the east of Broad Laying to the junction of roads about 1,000 feet west of Milking Bridge. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction crossing Milking Bridge to its junction with the main Newbury-Andover Road. Thence along the said main road in a southerly direction past Highclere to the Three-Legged Cross Inn. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction through Hurstbourne Tarrant and Knights Enham to the junction of Bridge Street High Street and London Street in the town of Andover, situated in the county of Southampton.

*Southern Boundary.*

Thence in a westerly direction along Bridge Street and Weyhill Road to Hundred Acre Corner, thence in a north-westerly direction past Weyhill to Ludgershall in the county of Wilts, passing through that town by way of Winchester Street, St. James Street and Butt Street, thence along the main road in a north-westerly direction to Everley and thence in a westerly direction past Lower Everley to Rowden's Cleeve. Thence in a northerly direction to Upavon Bridge in the town of Upavon.

*Western Boundary.*

Thence along the road in a westerly direction through Upavon to the cross-roads situated about 1,750 feet west of St. Mary's Church in the town of Upavon. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the road through Rushall and in a north-easterly direction over Wood Bridge to the smithy at Manningford Bruce. Thence along the road in a northerly direction crossing the River Avon and in a north-westerly direction crossing the Kennet and Avon Canal at Bristow Bridge, through the village of Oare past Rainscombe Hill Farm and Granham Hill to the point of departure in the town of Marlborough.

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*An Area of approximately 192 square miles situated in the County of Southampton.*

*Northern Boundary.*

Commencing at a point on the main road from Farnham to Basingstoke near Bowling Alley at the junction of Hyde Lane and about 4,600 feet north of All Saints' Church in the village of Crondall, thence along the main road in a westerly direction through the town of Odiham by way of Farnham Road and High Street and along the road in a north-westerly direction past North Warnborough, Hook Common and Natley Scures to the town of Basingstoke. Thence through Basingstoke by way of London Road, Eastrop Bridge, Basing Road, Chapel Street and Chapel Hill, continuing in a north-westerly direction along the road past Shothanger Farm to the town of Kingsclere, passing through this town by way of George Street thence past Field Gate Farm and continuing along the road in a westerly direction past Nothing Hill and Duncroft

Farm and in a north-westerly direction past Wellhouse Farm and Highclere Station to the junction with the main road from Newtown to Whitchurch. Thence along the said main road in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 1,400 feet, and in a north-westerly direction along the road past Penwood to its junction with the Newbury-Andover road near Milking Bridge.

*Western Boundary.*

Thence in a southerly and south-westerly direction along the Newbury-Andover road, through the village of Hurstbourne Tarrant and Knights Enham to the junction of High Street, Bridge Street and London Street in the town of Andover.

*Southern Boundary.*

Thence in an easterly direction along London Street and along the main road past Andover Down to the town of Whitchurch, passing through Whitchurch by way of Church Street, thence in a southerly direction along Winchester Street to a point 250 feet south of Poplar Terrace, thence in a south-easterly direction along the road past Knowle Farm and Cranbourne Wood to Micheldever Station, crossing the Southern Railway main line by Northbrook Farm and continuing along the road in an easterly and south-easterly direction past Larkwhistle Farm to the main Basingstoke-Winchester road. Thence along the road in a north-easterly direction to London Lodge. Thence along the branch road in an easterly and north-easterly direction to Woodmancott following the road skirting College Wood, past Breach Farm to the junction of roads about 2,000 feet to the north-east of Breach Farm. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of about 1,200 feet, thence following the foot-path in the same direction through Upper Barn Wood, past Upper Barn to Preston House Home Farm at Preston Candover. Thence along the road running in an easterly and north-easterly direction past Bradley Hill to the cross-roads near Preston Oak Hills. Thence in a south-easterly direction past Down Wood, Wadgett's Copse and Warren Farm to the town of Alton, passing through Alton by way of Lenten Street, Market Street, Normandy Street and Anstey Road, thence in a north-easterly direction through the villages of Anstey and Holybourne to Cuckoo's Corner. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction past Stean Farm, West Court, through the village of Binstead and past River Hill Farm to the cross-roads at Blacknest.

*Eastern Boundary.*

Thence in a northerly direction along the road crossing the Southern Railway at Isington, through the village of Bentley, past Bury Court, Glade Farm, Montgomery's Farm and Itchel Manor House to the cross-roads at Bowling Alley, the point of departure.

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*An Area of approximately 177 square miles situated in the Counties of Wilts, Dorset and Southampton.*

*Northern Boundary.*

Commencing from the village of Mottisfont in the county of Southampton at a point
