The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that a competitive Examination among Members of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service for appointment to the Clerical Classes (General and Departmental) of the Civil Service will be held, commencing on the 9th June, 1936, under the Regulations dated the 9th July, 1935, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Darlington, Edinburgh, Exeter, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Preston, Sheffield, Stoke-on-Trent and Swansea.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 16th April, 1936, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

## METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF HOLBORN.

*Notification and treatment of cases of acute rheumatism.*

Notice is hereby given under section 3 (3) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that regulations have been made by the Minister of Health entitled the Holborn (Acute Rheumatism) Regulations, 1935, extending until the 31st day of December, 1938, the operation of the Holborn (Acute Rheumatism) Regulations, 1932, which provided for the notification and treatment of certain cases of acute rheumatism (as defined in the regulations of 1932) within the Metropolitan Borough of Holborn.

## ROAD TRANSPORT LIGHTING ACT, 1927.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiry of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by Section 1 (2) of the Road Transport Lighting Act, 1927, to make Regulations requiring vehicles—

in the City of Liverpool,  
in the County Borough of Birkenhead,  
in the County Borough of Bootle,  
in the County Borough of Wallasey, and  
within the boundaries of the Mersey Dock Estate

exempt from the requirements of the Road Transport Lighting Act to be fitted with red reflectors and white surfaces.
