

divide the said close numbered 242 and the close numbered 241 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 213 and the closes numbered 243 and 246 upon the same maps for a distance of $17\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Barnwood from the said Parish of Upton Saint Leonard.

“ II. Also all that contiguous portion of the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, which is bounded upon the east and upon part of the north-east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, upon the remaining part of the north-east by the above mentioned detached portion of the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill, upon the north-west partly by the said New Parish of All Saints, Gloucester, and partly by the New Parish of Saint James, Gloucester, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Gloucester, from the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, at the centre of Chequers Bridge which carries the Gloucester Branch Line of the Great Western Railway across Coney Hill Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Coney Hill Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Highfield Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Highfield Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway and footpath leading to Barnwood Mill, and extending thence south-eastward along such roadway and footpath for a distance of $18\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, from the said Parish of Barnwood.

“ III. And also the above mentioned detached portion of the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, upon part of the south-west by the above described portion of the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, upon the remaining part of the south-west and upon the west by the said New Parish of All Saints, Gloucester.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Minister of the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order

and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of December, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester now vested in us:

“ Whereas under the Cathedral Measures, 1931 and 1934, and by virtue of an Order of Your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the said Measures, bearing date the 13th day of August, 1935, whereof notice was duly published in the London Gazette of the 16th day of the same month, and confirming a Scheme prepared by the Cathedral Commissioners for England for the said Cathedral Church of Chichester dated the 15th day of February, 1935, a copy whereof is annexed to the said Order in Council certain lands and hereditaments which then belonged to the said Dean and Chapter of Chichester and which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed were transferred to and became absolutely vested in us to be held by us in the same manner and for the same purposes as the property of which the rents and profits are to be carried over to our Common Fund:

“ And whereas the properties aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

“ Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to convey from time to time all or any part of the said properties transferred to and vested in us as aforesaid for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.
