THE MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 5), 1935, DATED DECEMBER 31, 1935, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 3 (1) OF THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. C. 53).

Whereas by Section 3 subsection (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused, or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order, or any particular provisions of the Order, shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the direction is in force, have effect subject thereto:

And whereas by Article I of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1935, (a) it is ordered that it shall not be lawful to import into the United Kingdom or if imported, to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom, any goods of the following descriptions:—

(a) Planed and tongued and grooved or planed and otherwise manufactured hardwood flooring blocks or strips;

(b) Hardwood parquet flooring in sections composed of blocks or strips glued or otherwise joined together;

(c) Planed and tongued and grooved, or planed and otherwise manufactured softwood flooring blocks;

unless they bear an indication of origin:

And whereas by paragraph (a) of Article 2 of the said Order it is subject as therein provided, ordered that in the case of flooring blocks and strips the indication of origin shall be impressed or incised at intervals of not more than nine inches on one of the larger surfaces:

And whereas by Article 5 of the said Order it is ordered that the said Order shall come into force at the expiration of three months from the date thereof but until the 1st January, 1936, shall not apply to the sale or exposure for sale in the United Kingdom of any goods to which the said Order applies which were imported prior to the date on which the said Order shall come into force:

And whereas the Board of Trade being the appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 2 (a) to flooring strips (other than thin battens or strips for parquet flooring) imported prior to the twenty-ninth day of June, 1935, and sold or exposed for sale before the first day of January, 1937, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. Until the first day of January, 1937, paragraph (a) of Article 2 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1935, shall not apply to flooring strips (other than thin battens or strips for parquet flooring) which were imported prior to the twenty-ninth day of June, 1935, and which are sold or exposed for sale in bundles provided that each bundle bears an indication of origin prominently stamped, stencilled, printed, impressed or incised every nine inches along the length of any two sides of the bundle.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 5), 1935.

SCHEDULE.

The South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Clause 4 of the Scheme shall be amended in manner following, that is to say:—

(a) By deleting sub-clause (i) thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

"(i) (a) Each Owner shall appoint one representative and one associate for the purposes of the Scheme (herein particularly called "the ordinary representative" or "the ordinary associate" as the case may be).

(b) Each Owner may further appoint one additional representative and one additional associate (herein particularly called "the tonnage representative" or "the tonnage associate" as the case may be) in respect of each complete 1,000,000 tons of the annual output standard tonnage of his undertaking in force for the time being.

(c) In the event of the ordinary representative or associate being removed or ceasing to be such then the Board until the appointment of a representative or associate in his place shall be entitled to treat the representative or associate who may be first on the list of tonnage representatives and associates of the Owner as being the ordinary representative or associate respectively of the Owner for the purpose of paragraph (a) of sub-clause (i) of this Clause."

(b) In sub-clause (ii) by deleting the word "his" where that word first occurs and inserting in lieu thereof the word "a".

(c) By deleting sub-clause (vii) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

"(vii) In the event of an undertaking being transferred then the following provisions shall apply, namely:—

(a) If the acquiring Owner has no representative or associate at the time, then the Board shall be entitled to treat the representatives and associates of the transferring Owner as the representatives and associates respectively of the acquiring Owner until notice of the removal of such representatives or associates, and such satisfactory evidence of the transfer of the undertaking is given to the Board as they shall require.

(b) In the event of the acquiring Owner already having representatives and associates, then as from the date of the transfer of the undertaking being notified to the Board, the representatives and associates respectively of the transferring Owner shall be deemed to have been removed by and to have ceased to act on

behalf of the transferring Owner provided that the acquiring Owner shall then be entitled to appoint additional tonnage representatives and associates in accordance with the provisions of sub-clause (i) (b) of this Clause by reference to the combined annual output standard tonnages of his undertakings."

(d) By adding the following sub-clause:—

"(viii) For the purpose of operating the provisions of sub-clause (i) hereof, each Owner shall by the 31st January in every year specify the names, addresses and occupations of his representatives and associates and in particular shall at any time and from time to time, where necessary, reduce the number of his tonnage representatives and associates to conform with the annual output standard tonnage of his undertaking as specified in this Clause."

2. The following Clause shall be substituted for Clause 9 of the Second Schedule to the Scheme, that is to say:—

"9. (1) The attendance and voting of Owners at General Meetings shall be effected through their representatives or associates and no person not being either a representative or an associate shall be entitled to attend or vote at any General Meeting.

(2) (a) In the case where only an ordinary representative and an ordinary associate are appointed, then the ordinary associate shall not be entitled to attend or vote at any meeting at which the ordinary representative is present.

(b) Where an Owner appoints tonnage representatives or tonnage associates under the provisions of Clause 4 of the Scheme, then—

(i) The said tonnage representatives and associates shall not be entitled to vote at any meetings if the ordinary representative or ordinary associate votes.

(ii) The number of representatives and associates attending a General Meeting on behalf of an Owner shall be limited to one-half the total number of representatives and associates the Owner will be entitled to appoint under the provisions of Clause 4 of the Scheme.

(iii) For the purpose of voting at any meeting the votes of any Owner shall be given only by one of the representatives or associates who may be present at the meeting on behalf of that Owner the same to be determined in the following order, namely: Ordinary representative, ordinary associate, followed by tonnage representative and tonnage associate respectively in the order in which they are placed upon a list on which the Owner notified the order of voting to the Board, or failing such list, in order of date of appointment by the Owner."

*Civil Service Commission.**January 3, 1936.*

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF JUNIOR ASSISTANTS IN THE SCIENCE MUSEUM LIBRARY, BOARD OF EDUCATION.

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. They do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or who are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Board of Education will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Director of the Science Museum and shall be made on the appropriate form. He will examine the candidates' credentials and take such other steps as seem good to him to ascertain their qualifications, and will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the best qualifications for any existing or prospective vacancy to the Board of Education for approval of their candidature. The papers of candidates thus approved will be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education as in their opinion fits them for the post. In general, candidates should possess a university honours degree in Science or other equivalent qualifications, together with a knowledge of one or more Modern Languages. The Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Board of Education and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Board of Education, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and, when practicable, one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' records of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidates' work, whether at school, at the university, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be

required to pay a fee of £1. A selected candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 5s., towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three farthings of the average of the prices per pound at which cheese such as is commonly known at the commencement of the Act as "New Zealand Finest White" and "Canadian Finest White" was sold wholesale in Great Britain during the immediately preceding month;

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before April, 1938, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of January, 1936, is 4.46 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
