At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December, 1935.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of December, 1935 (N. 5133/35), in the words following, viz. :--

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

"And whereas under the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 17th day of May, 1920, the pay of men sent sick to hospital from ships at home with disabilities due to their own misconduct, carelessness or neglect is subject to stoppages at rates laid down in the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the pay of Naval ratings other than non-European natives, and of Royal Marines (other ranks) sent to hospitals abroad should similarly be subject to stoppages at rate: and under conditions similar to those applicable to men

sent to hospitals at home:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 3rd day of July, 1909, it is provided that men and boys sent home sick from abroad shall be allowed thirty days' pay free of stoppages from the date of their entry into hospital in England:

And whereas we consider that such pro-

vision is no longer necessary:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction hospital stoppages after the first 30 days in hospital for Naval ratings (other than non-European natives) and Royal Marines (other ranks) who are sent to hospital abroad on or after 1st February, 1936, with disabilities due to their own misconduct, carelessness or neglect, at the rates and under the conditions applicable to men in home hospitals, the Order in Council of the 3rd day of July, 1909, whereby 30 days' free treatment is granted to sick ratings from abroad after entry into a home hospital being abrogated.

" The Lords Commissioners Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Rules under Section 21 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933, prescribing the manner of an appeal by a person aggrieved by the refusal of a local authority to enter his name in the list kept by that authority in pursuance of Section 21 of the Act or by the removal of his name from the said list by the local authority.

The Rules, which are intended to come into force on May 1st, 1936, require that such an appeal shall be made in accordance with the provisions of the Quarter Sessions Act, 1849, to the next practicable Court of Quarter Sessions having jurisdiction in the county or borough in which the premises of the appellant are situate and held not less than twenty-one clear days after notification of the refusal or removal, as the case may be, is given to him

by the local authority.
