THE GAS FUND (CONTRIBUTION) ORDER, 1936, DATED JANUARY 1, 1936, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5. C. 28) AS AMENDED BY THE GAS UNDERTAKINGS ACT, 1934 (24 & 25 GEO. 5. C. 28).

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 7 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, as amended by the Gas Undertakings Act, 1934, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe as follows:—

- 1. The rate of contribution to the Gas Fund for the year 1936 shall be—

- 3. Payment of the contribution shall be by cheque made payable to the "Board of Trade" and crossed "Bank of England".
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Gas Fund (Contribution) Order, 1936.
