PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** by the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1922, as amended by the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1933 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), provision was made for the administration of the Government of the territories known as the Protectorate of Nigeria:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provision in certain respects than in the said Orders is contained for the administration of the Government of the said Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1935, and shall be construed as one with the Principal Order.

II. Clauses V, XVIII, and XX of the Principal Order, and the Nigeria Protectorate Order in Council, 1933, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the following Clause is hereby

substituted for Clause XX of the Principal Order:—

“XX. The Governor may, subject to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him by His Majesty through one of His Principal Secretaries of State, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss or suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any public office within the Protectorate, or subject as aforesaid, may take such other disciplinary action as may seem to him desirable.”

III. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation in the Nigeria Gazette, and shall be published in such Gazette; and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Protectorate of Nigeria.

IV. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Malcolm MacDonald, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 24th January, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-19, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th January, 1936, to Saturday, the 1st February, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

(d) from north to south on the east section of the Carfax, Horsham, from North Street to a point opposite Barclays Bank, Limited;

(e) from east to west on the south section of the Carfax, on the south of Inner Circle, Horsham;

(f) in such a direction as to keep the central island site in Carfax (Inner Circle), Horsham, on the right hand side or off side of the vehicle;

(g) from west to east on Middle Street, Horsham;

(h) from west to east on West Street, Horsham.
