THE PROCLAMATION OF HIS MAJESTY KING EDWARD VIII.

In pursuance of the Order in Council of the 21st January, His Majesty's Officers of Arms this day made Proclamation declaring the Accession of His Majesty King Edward VIII.

At ten o'clock the Officers of Arms, habited in their Tabards, assembled at St. James's Palace and, attended by the Serjeants at Arms, proceeded to the balcony in Friary Court, where, after the trumpets had sounded thrice, the Proclamation was read by Sir Gerald W. Wollaston, K.C.V.O., Garter Principal King of Arms. A procession was then formed in the following order, the Kings of Arms, Heralds, and Pursuivants and the Serjeants at Arms being in Royal carriages.

The Procession moved on to Charing Cross, where the Proclamation was read the second time by Lancaster Herald, and then moved on to the site of Temple Bar, where a temporary barrier was placed across the street to mark the boundary of the City of London.

Bluemantle Pursuivant advanced between two Trumpeters, preceded by two of the Royal Horse Guards, and demanded, in the ancient form, admission into the City.

On being admitted, he was conducted by the City Marshal to the Lord Mayor, who was in

attendance in his State carriage, together with the Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs and other Officers of the City, and, the Order in Council having been delivered to his Lordship, the barrier was then directed to be removed. Bluemantle Pursuivant having been conducted to his place in the Procession, it moved on into the City, the High Bailiff of Westminster filing off at the site of Temple Bar.

At the corner of Chancery Lane the Proclamation was read the third time by Norroy King of Arms. The Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Recorder, Sheriffs and Officers of the City of London then joined the Procession immediately after the Officers of Arms, and the whole advanced to the Royal Exchange, where the Proclamation was read the fourth and last time by Clarenceux King of Arms.

The streets through which the Procession passed were lined by Troops.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of January, 1936 (C.W. 5271/35), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas it has been considered expedient to widen the field of selection of candidates for Commissions in Your Majesty's Royal Marines to include candidates from Universities:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated 13th October, 1920, it is provided that Lieutenants, R.M. who passed the prescribed examination may be promoted to the rank of Captain in vacancies on the Establishment and if not so promoted within 12 years from date of seniority as Second Lieutenant, may be eligible for promotion to Captain on the expiration of such 12 years provided no seniority has been forfeited by sentence of Court Martial or otherwise:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the 18th day of June, 1934, the granting of commissions to suitable candidates from the Universities under the conditions set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" UNIVERSITY CANDIDATES.

" 1. Age limits to be 20½ years to 22 years.
" 2. Antedates of 1 year 4 months to 2 years 4 months to be granted after completion of probationary courses of instruction on the following scale:—

(i) All candidates to receive a provisional antedate of 2 years on account of age.

(ii) Such antedates to be increased or decreased at our discretion within the above limits.

" 3. Pay not to be admissible for the period of the antedate, but the period to count towards

(a) Increase of pay after 8 and 10 years' service.

(b) The 12 years' service for promotion to Captain.

(c) Seniority for the purpose of relative rank.

" 4. The antedate not to count towards the qualifying service required for purposes of retirement or retired pay."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council by the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1932, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1935, amending the first mentioned Order (which, as so amended, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), made certain provisions of the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order,

1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1933, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1934, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1934, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1934, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1935, applicable to certain British Possessions and certain territories under His Majesty's protection and to registered aircraft being the property of British subjects resident or companies incorporated therein:

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers enabling Him in this behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following sub-paragraph shall be substituted for sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (1) of Article 5 of the principal Order:—

“(iii) Except as may be provided in the proclamation whereby the prohibited area is established, or in any subsequent proclamation, the aircraft shall not land in any prohibited area as defined in this Order and shall not fly over any such area;”

2. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1936.

WHEREAS by the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, provision has been made for the enforcement in England and Ireland of maintenance orders made by a Court in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the said Act extends:

And whereas by the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council extend the said Act to that part, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's dominions to which the said Act extends:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of that part of His Majesty's dominions hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within England and Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1920, shall apply to the part

of His Majesty's dominions hereunder mentioned:—

The Cayman Islands.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the making, registration, confirmation or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any maintenance order as defined in sections 10 and 11 of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (2) of section eighteen of the Superannuation Act, 1935, that His Majesty may, by an Order in Council made in pursuance of a Resolution passed by both Houses of the Parliament of Northern Ireland, direct that the said Act or any provisions thereof shall, subject to such exceptions and adaptations as may be specified in the Order, apply to existing Irish officers within the meaning of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, to whom the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914, apply by virtue of sub-section (2) of section fifty-five of that Act, but that save as aforesaid the Superannuation Act, 1935, shall not apply to any of the said officers:

And whereas such a Resolution as aforesaid has been passed by both Houses of the said Parliament, praying that the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1935, hereafter specified in this Order may, subject to such exceptions and adaptations as may be so specified, be applied to the said officers:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Resolution and by virtue of all powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Superannuation Act (Application to Northern Ireland officers) Order, 1936.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

The expression "the Act" means the Superannuation Act, 1935:

The expression "existing Irish officers" means existing Irish officers within the meaning of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, to whom the Superannuation Acts, 1834 to 1914, apply by virtue of sub-section (2) of section fifty-five of that Act.

2. The following provisions of the Act shall apply to existing Irish officers, subject to the exceptions and adaptations specified in Article 3 of this Order, that is to say—

Sub-sections (2) and (3) of section one;

Sections two, four, five, six, eight and eleven;

Sub-sections (1), (2), (4) and (6) of section twelve;

Sections fourteen, sixteen and seventeen;

Sub-section (1) of section eighteen.

3. The said provisions of the Act shall, in their application to existing Irish officers, be subject to the following exceptions and adaptations:—

(a) References to civil servants, and officers or persons serving in or retiring from the service, shall be construed as references to existing Irish officers serving in or retiring from the civil service of the Government of Northern Ireland, and references to service in the permanent civil service of the State, the civil service or the service shall be construed as including service in the civil service of the said Government;

(b) References to the Treasury, where they occur in relation to the grant and ascertainment of the amount of any allowance or gratuity under the Superannuation Acts, shall be construed as references to the Civil Service Committee for Northern Ireland established by section fifty-six of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and Article 7 of the First Schedule to the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922;

(c) References to the Treasury, other than such references as are mentioned in the last preceding paragraph, shall be construed as references to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland;

(d) In sub-section (2) of section one, for the words "there may be granted to her or her legal personal representatives such superannuation and other allowances and gratuity as might be granted had she entered the service after the commencement of this Act" there shall be substituted the words "sections one and two of that Act, as amended by section two of the Superannuation Act, 1914, and by this Act, shall apply in relation to her as they apply in relation to male existing Irish officers";

(e) In sub-section (1) of section two, for the words "three months after the commencement of this Act", in both places where they occur, there shall be substituted the words "the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-five";

(f) In sub-section (1) of section four, for the words "five years after the commencement of this Act" there shall be substituted the words "the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and forty";

(g) Subject to the provisions of the three last preceding paragraphs, for the words "the commencement of this Act" there shall be substituted the words "the seventeenth day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-five";

(h) In section twelve, the references in sub-sections (1), (2) and (4) to the Civil Service Bonus Scheme shall be construed as referring to the scheme for the payment of a cost-of-living bonus related to cost-of-living figures to persons employed in the civil service of the Government of Northern Ireland, which operated in respect of the period from the establishment of that service until the beginning of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-four, the references in sub-sections (1) and (4) to bonuses other than those received under the Civil Service Bonus Scheme shall be omitted, and in sub-section (6) the words from the first "any annual allowance" to "save as aforesaid" (inclusive) shall be omitted;

(i) In sub-section (1) of section fourteen the words "except sub-section (2) of section fifty-five of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920" shall be omitted, and the proviso to the said sub-section and sub-section (2) of the said section fourteen shall not apply;

(j) In section sixteen the reference to Parliament shall be construed as a reference to the Parliament of Northern Ireland;

(k) In section seventeen, the words "or this Act" shall be omitted.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas by the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924 (as amended by the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1925), His Majesty's Criminal and Civil Jurisdiction in Zanzibar is, subject to the provisions of the said Order, vested in His Britannic Majesty's High Court for Zanzibar, and by Article 29 of that Order provision is made for appeals to His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa from findings, orders, and sentences of the said Court in the exercise of its criminal jurisdiction:

And whereas by the Zanzibar Criminal Procedure Decree, 1934, which now forms Chapter 8 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Zanzibar Protectorate, other provision is made regarding such appeals; and it is expedient to amend the said Article 29 in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1936."

2. Article 29 of the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following article is substituted therefor:—

"29.—(1) An appeal shall lie to His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa (in this Order referred to as "the Court of Appeal") from any finding, order, or sentence recorded or passed by the High Court in the exercise of its original criminal jurisdiction, provided that such finding, order, or sentence is appealable under the Criminal Procedure Decree (Chapter 8 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Zanzibar Protectorate in force on the 31st day of December, 1934), or any Decree relating to criminal procedure amending that Decree, or substituted therefor, and for the time being countersigned by the British Resident.

(2) Save as aforesaid the Court of Appeal shall not have any power of revision or appeal over or from any finding, order, or sentence recorded or passed by the High Court in the exercise of its criminal jurisdiction."

3. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Zanzibar Government, and shall thereupon come into operation.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to Basutoland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above mentioned Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall from the date of this Order apply to Basutoland.

And the Right Honourable Malcolm MacDonald, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of December, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd

and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Gilsland with Over Denton, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gilsland with Over Denton is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir George Augustus Mounsey, K.C.M.G., C.B., O.B.E., of Number 96A, Mount Street, in the City of Westminster:

"And whereas the said George Augustus Mounsey is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gilsland with Over Denton now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Carlisle for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, now Bishop of Carlisle, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Gilsland with Over Denton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Gilsland and Over Denton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Augustus Mounsey (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gilsland with Over Denton now vested in him, the said George Augustus Mounsey as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry

Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.
