

(i) In sub-section (1) of section fourteen the words "except sub-section (2) of section fifty-five of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920" shall be omitted, and the proviso to the said sub-section and sub-section (2) of the said section fourteen shall not apply;

(j) In section sixteen the reference to Parliament shall be construed as a reference to the Parliament of Northern Ireland;

(k) In section seventeen, the words "or this Act" shall be omitted.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas by the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924 (as amended by the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1925), His Majesty's Criminal and Civil Jurisdiction in Zanzibar is, subject to the provisions of the said Order, vested in His Britannic Majesty's High Court for Zanzibar, and by Article 29 of that Order provision is made for appeals to His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa from findings, orders, and sentences of the said Court in the exercise of its criminal jurisdiction:

And whereas by the Zanzibar Criminal Procedure Decree, 1934, which now forms Chapter 8 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Zanzibar Protectorate, other provision is made regarding such appeals; and it is expedient to amend the said Article 29 in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1936."

2. Article 29 of the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1924, is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following article is substituted therefor:—

"29.—(1) An appeal shall lie to His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa (in this Order referred to as "the Court of Appeal") from any finding, order, or sentence recorded or passed by the High Court in the exercise of its original criminal jurisdiction, provided that such finding, order, or sentence is appealable under the Criminal Procedure Decree (Chapter 8 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Zanzibar Protectorate in force on the 31st day of December, 1934), or any Decree relating to criminal procedure amending that Decree, or substituted therefor, and for the time being countersigned by the British Resident.

(2) Save as aforesaid the Court of Appeal shall not have any power of revision or appeal over or from any finding, order, or sentence recorded or passed by the High Court in the exercise of its criminal jurisdiction."

3. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the Zanzibar Government, and shall thereupon come into operation.

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to Basutoland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above mentioned Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall from the date of this Order apply to Basutoland.

And the Right Honourable Malcolm MacDonald, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of December, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd
