whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Catsfield now vested in her, the said Idina Mary, Countess Brassey, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric

for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly

lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Langho Billington (commonly known as Langho) and the New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 11th day of August, 1842, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the following month, Chapelry Districts were assigned to the consecrated Church known as Langho Chapel, and the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Salesbury, both situate in the Parish of Blackburn, in the said County of Lancaster and at that time in the Diocese of Chester but now in the said Diocese of Blackburn, and such Chapelry Districts were named 'The Chapelry District of Langho Billington' and 'The Chapelry District of Saint Peter, Salesbury', respectively:

"And whereas the said Chapelry District of Langho Billington and the said Chapelry District of Saint Peter, Salesbury, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Langho Billington and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publica-tion in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Langho Billington and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Salesbury, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Langho Billington.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.
