FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1936 (No. 11).

SUBJECT.

Further contracts the Wiltshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as from the 10th February, 1936, to the area as described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Wilts.

The parishes of Dauntsey, Great Somerford, Christian Malford, Sutton Benger, Stanton St. Quintin, Kington Langley, Bremhill, Langley Burrell Without, so much of the parish of Kington St. Michael as lies to the east of the road running from Stanton Park via Lower Priory Farm and Kington St. Michael Church to the Plough Inn; so much of the parish of Pewsham as lies to the north of the road running from Chippenham via Jay's Farm and Derry Wood to Calne; and so much of the parishes of Hilmarton and Lyneham as lies to the west of the road running from Calne via Hilmarton, Church End and Lyneham to Dauntsey Lock on the Wilts. and Berks. Canal.

MILK ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting jointly, have certified the cheese-milk price for the month of February, 1936, as required by sub-section 2 of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934, in the following terms:—

Certification of Cheese-Milk Price.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three farthings of the average of the prices per pound at which cheese such as is commonly known at the commencement of the Act as "New Zealand Finest White" and "Canadian Finest White" was sold wholesale in Great Britain during the immediately preceding month;

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said Section the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before April, 1938, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of February, 1936, is 4.57 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
