WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

(John Thomas Evans.)

Whereas John Thomas Evans, M.P.S., Trading as Pasmore & Company, at 93, Mortimer Street, London, W.1, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said John Thomas Evans cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said John Thomas Evans the authority granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the

retailing of poisons to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, or to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian hemp, or any preparation to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, or to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Act applies.
