PLYMPTON ST. MARY.

Whereas the Rural District Council of Plympton St. Mary have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Ivybridge Urban District Water Act, 1912, and the Plympton St. Mary Rural District Council Acts, 1928 and 1933, so as:—

(a) to provide that the maximum rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes in the area hitherto supplied under the Ivybridge Act shall be ten per cent. on the gross value of the premises supplied, subject to a minimum charge of fifteen shillings per annum; that the charge in respect of every water closet beyond the first shall be seven shillings and sixpence per annum; that the charge in respect of every fixed bath capable of containing not more than fifty gallons shall be ten shillings per annum; and that the charge for supplies by measure shall be two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons with a minimum charge of fifteen shillings per quarter;

(b) to empower the Minister by Order on application being made to him to increase or decrease such rates and charges;

(c) to provide that water obtained from works authorised by the Ivybridge Act may be used for any other part of the Rural District;

(d) to authorise the Rural District Council to make byelaws for the prevention of pollution of water in the Parish of Harford;

(e) to make applicable to the Parish of Ivybridge certain provisions of the said Acts of 1928 and 1933;

(f) for the several purposes of this application, or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the District or in the parish of Ivybridge as may be necessary or desirable.

And whereas it is proposed to issue a Provisional Order generally in accordance with the said application but to provide that subject to the charges proposed to be authorised as aforesaid the Ivybridge water undertaking shall form part of the water undertaking authorised by the said Acts of 1928 and 1933 and shall be governed by the provisions of those Acts.
