Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Urban District Councils of Ashbourne and New Mills and the Rural District Councils of Ashbourne, Bakewell and Chapel-en-le-Frith are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Peak Joint Planning Committee intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Secretary to the Committee.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING REGULATIONS, 1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that (1) On the 19th day of February, 1936, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the resolution of the Sutton in Ashfield Urban District Council dated the 2nd day of December, 1935,

deciding to prepare the above planning scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the Urban District of Sutton in Ashfield. (2) A certified copy of the map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Council Offices, Forest Lodge, Station Road, Sutton in Ashfield, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. except on Saturdays, when the hours will be 10 a.m. and 12 noon respectively. (3) Any person who is or claims to be an owner of any property in the area, and any association representing owners of property within the Urban District of Sutton in Ashfield, and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Sutton in Ashfield Urban District Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted, to the extent specified in the Order, and in addition, the Sutton in Ashfield Urban District Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation.
