*Westminster, 27th February, 1936.*

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

Unemployment Assistance (Temporary Provisions) (Extension) Act, 1936.

Edinburgh Corporation Order Confirmation Act, 1936.

His late Majesty KING GEORGE THE FIFTH, was graciously pleased (by Warrant bearing the above date) to give and grant unto Charles Royds, of the Old Elms, Lowfield Heath, Crawley, in the County of Surrey, Gentleman, His Royal Licence and Authority that he might take and thenceforth use the surname of Fletcher-Twemlow in substitution for that of Royds, and bear the Arms of Fletcher and Twemlow Quarterly with his own family Arms, and that such surname, and Arms might, in like manner be taken and used by his issue: the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms.

His late Majesty was pleased to grant unto Oliver Robin Gaskell of Levens Hall in the Parish of Weversham in the County of Westmorland, Gentleman, second son of Henry Melville Gaskell of Kiddington Hall in the Parish of Woodstock in the County of Oxford, Esquire, a Justice of the Peace for the said County and Dorothy his wife sister of Sir Alan Desmond Bagot of Levens Hall aforesaid, Baronet, deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may henceforth assume the surname of Bagot in lieu of his own surname of Gaskell and that he may bear the Arms of Bagot quarterly in the first and fourth quarters with his own Arms of Gaskell
