"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas by an Order in Council of His late Majesty, bearing date the 26th June, 1933, a pension at the rate of £115 15s. 4d. a year was granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. H. T. Arnold, a former Master in the Royal Hospital School when at Greenwich:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Mr. Arnold is entitled to an addition to this pension in respect of the sums contributed by him towards a deferred annuity fund:

"And whereas the operation of the Teachers (Superannuation) Act, 1935, should, in our

opinion, automatically increase as from 1st July, 1935, the above pension of £115 15s. 4d. :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of two further pensions to Mr. Arnold at the rate of Fifteen pounds eight shillings (£15 8s.) and Thirteen shillings and two pence (13s. 2d.) per annum as from the 2nd December, 1934 and the 1st July, 1935 respectively."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 14th May, 1912, and the 16th November, 1917, provision is made for an allowance of threepence a day to ratings employed on clerical duties with the Gunnery Officer and the Torpedo Officer respectively in Your Majesty's Ships and Naval Establishments:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that a similar allowance should be payable to the rating employed on clerical work with the Officer borne for anti-submarine duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of an allowance of threepence a day accordingly, with effect from the 22nd day of January, 1936.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

(a) that any profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to a person resident in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom through an agency in the United Kingdom or to a person resident in the United Kingdom through an agency in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in that part of His Majesty's dominions; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the Declaration have been made with the Government concerned with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation,

then, unless and until the Declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from United Kingdom income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the part of His Majesty's dominions, have the effect of law in the part of His Majesty's dominions:

And whereas it is enacted by a proviso to the said subsection that no such arrangements as aforesaid shall exempt from United Kingdom income tax any profits or gains which either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue to a person resident in the United Kingdom; or

(iii) accrue to a person not resident in the United Kingdom directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through any agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts:

And whereas the Agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and His Majesty's Government in Canada:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to persons resident in Canada through agencies in the United Kingdom or to persons resident in the United Kingdom through agencies in Canada are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in Canada; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Agreement have been made with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Agency Profits (Canada) Declaration, 1936."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN CANADA.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and His Majesty's Government in Canada, being desirous of concluding an agreement for reciprocal exemption from income tax in certain cases of profits or gains arising through an agency, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland undertake that the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article 2 hereof remains effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Sur-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and will take the necessary action under section seventeen of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1930, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains from the sale of goods, other than things in action and money, arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the United Kingdom, to a person who is resident in Canada and is not resident in the United Kingdom, unless the profits or gains either—

(1) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom, or

(2) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through an agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 2.

His Majesty's Government in Canada undertake that the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective, be exempted from income tax chargeable by the Dominion of Canada in respect of the 1930 taxation period and fiscal periods ending therein, and thereafter, and will take the necessary action under subsection 3 of section 27A of the Income War Tax Act as enacted by section 14 of Chapter 55 of the Statutes of 1934 with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains from the sale of goods, other than things in action and money, arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in Canada, to a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in Canada, unless the profits or gains either—

(1) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in Canada, or

(2) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in Canada, or through an agency in Canada where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 3.

For the purposes of this Agreement the word "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate, and a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom, and shall be regarded as resident in Canada if its business is managed and controlled in Canada.

Article 4.

This agreement may be denounced at any time upon six months' notice being given by one Government to the other.

And whereas it is enacted by a proviso to the said subsection that no such arrangements as aforesaid shall exempt from United Kingdom income tax any profits or gains which either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue to a person resident in the United Kingdom; or

(iii) accrue to a person not resident in the United Kingdom directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through any agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts:

And whereas the arrangements contained in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with the Government of Newfoundland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to persons resident in Newfoundland through agencies in the United Kingdom are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in Newfoundland, and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Schedule have been made with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Agency Profits (Newfoundland) Declaration, 1936".

SCHEDULE.

1. His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland undertake that the profits or gains to which this paragraph relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in paragraph 2 below remains effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Sur-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and will take the necessary action under section seventeen of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1930, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this paragraph relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the United Kingdom to a person who is resident in Newfoundland and is not resident in the United Kingdom, unless the profits or gains either—

(1) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom, or

(2) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through an agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

2. The Government of Newfoundland undertake that the profits or gains to which this paragraph relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in paragraph 1 above remains effective, be exempted from Income Tax chargeable in Newfoundland for the year of assessment commencing on the first day of January, 1935, and for every subsequent year of assessment.

The profits or gains to which this paragraph relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in Newfoundland to a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in Newfoundland, unless the profits or gains either—

(1) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in Newfoundland or

(2) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in Newfoundland or through an agency in Newfoundland where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

3. For the purposes of these arrangements a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom and shall be regarded as resident in Newfoundland if its business is managed and controlled in Newfoundland.

4. These arrangements may be terminated at any time upon six months' notice being given by one Government to the other.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (2) of section twenty-three of the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act, 1935 (hereinafter called "the Act"), that the provisions of the Act relating to the crediting to approved societies out of the Unemployment Arrears Fund of sums in respect of arrears of contribution due to unemployment shall not extend to Northern Ireland, but that if provision appearing to His Majesty substantially to correspond to the provisions of the Act relating to contributions to that Fund is made by the Parliament of Northern Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the first mentioned provisions shall, with or without adaptations and modifications, extend to Northern Ireland:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that provision substantially corresponding to the aforesaid provisions of the Act relating to contributions to the Unemployment Arrears Fund has been made by section two of the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1935:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by subsection (2) of section twenty-three of the Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Extension of Entitlements to Northern Ireland) Order, 1936.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The provisions of subsection (4) of section eleven of the Act, which relate to the crediting to approved societies out of the Unemployment Arrears Fund of sums in respect of arrears of contributions due to unemployment, shall extend to approved societies and to the members thereof in Northern Ireland.

3. The provisions of this Order shall have effect with respect to the contribution year beginning on the second day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-four and with respect to succeeding contribution years.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a

Scheme bearing date the 30th day of January, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeacons of Rochester and Tonbridge, both in the Diocese of Rochester, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeacons:

“Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeacons of Rochester and Tonbridge and to some of the Rural Deaneries within those Archdeacons are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Rochester and such new Rural Deanery shall be called ‘The Rural Deanery of Chislehurst’, and shall comprise and consist of the Parishes of Chislehurst; The Annunciation, Chislehurst; Christ Church, Chislehurst; Crocken Hill; Saint Paul’s Cray; and Saint Mary, Swanley, and the District of Saint Francis, Petts Wood, all at present in the Rural Deanery of Bromley, and the Parishes of Bexley (with the Church of Saint John the Evangelist); Foot’s Cray; Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey; Holy Trinity, Lamorbey; North Cray; Saint John, Sidcup; and Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, all at present in the Rural Deanery of Dartford, which said Rural Deaneries of Bromley and Dartford are at present in the said Archdeaconry of Rochester; secondly, the following Parishes or Cures shall be transferred from one Rural Deanery to another in the said Archdeaconry of Rochester, that is to say, the Parishes of Downe, Hayes, and Keston and the District of Saint Mark, Biggin Hill, all at present in the Rural Deanery of Beckenham, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Bromley, the Parish of Saint Mary, Shortlands, at present in the said Rural Deanery of Bromley, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Beckenham, the Parishes of Darenth and Stone, at present in the Rural Deanery of Gravesend, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Dartford, the Parishes of Nurstead with Ifield, and Shorne, at present in the Rural Deanery of Cobham, shall be transferred to the said Rural Deanery of Gravesend, and the Parish of Frindsbury, at present in the Rural Deanery of Cliffe at Hoo,

shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Rochester; thirdly, the Parish of Cudham, at present in the said Rural Deanery of Beckenham, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Sevenoaks, in the said Archdeaconry of Tonbridge; fourthly, the Parishes of Eynsford and Lullingstone, at present in the said Rural Deanery of Bromley, shall be transferred to the Rural Deanery of Shoreham, in the said Archdeaconry of Tonbridge; and fifthly, the Parish of Christ Church, Lower Birling, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Malling, in the said Archdeaconry of Tonbridge, to the said Rural Deanery of Cobham, in the said Archdeaconry of Rochester, and each of the Parishes or Cures hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas Notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Rochester and to the Archdeacon of Tonbridge and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of October, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Edmund, situate in the Parish of Leeds, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas the said Church of Saint Edmund was consecrated on the 17th day of April, 1876:

"And whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, dated the 7th day of February, 1877, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the said Church of Saint Edmund:

"And whereas by Section 14 of the Leeds Churches Act, 1901, provision was made for the union to and merger in the said Parish of Leeds, of the ecclesiastical district attached or assigned to the said Church of Saint Edmund, and such union and merger have since become effective:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Edmund is now a Chapel of Ease to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Leeds:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Edmund has ceased to be used and is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consents of the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon, and of the Reverend Canon William Thompson Elliott, now Incumbent of the Benefice of the said Parish of Leeds (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"(a) That the said Church of Saint Edmund shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a proposed new Church at Gipton, in the said Diocese of Ripon.

"(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Edmund shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Leeds or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Ripon and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Edmund or such of them as the Bishop of Ripon shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Leeds, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Ripon for use in any other Church or Chapel or

Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Ripon which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Edmund as aforesaid.

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the site of the said Church of Saint Edmund.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."
