in the Second Schedule to the Act, as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in this Order, apply to ships registered in Hong Kong (hereinafter referred to as the Colony) in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:---

1. The provisions of the Act shall apply to British ships registered in the Colony in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—

(1) For the expressions "the Board of Trade" and "officers of the Board of Trade" there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "the Governor" and "officers authorised for such purpose by the Governor";

(2) In subsection (3) of Section 1 of the Act the words from "but in the case of a ship" to the end of the subsection shall be omitted;

(3) The first paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be amended by the insertion of the words ", in the opinion of the court having cognizance of any case in relation to such person," after the words "who is";

(4) The second paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be omitted and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor:—

"The expression 'ship" means any seagoing ship or boat of any description which is registered in Hong Kong as a British ship but does not include—

(a) any tug, dredger, sludge vessel, barge or other craft whose ordinary course of navigation does not extend beyond the waters of the Colony if and so long as such vessel is engaged in her ordinary. occupation;

(b) any River Steamer as defined by Section 2 (1) of the Merchant Shipping Ordinance 1899 of the Legislature of the Colony; or

(c) any fishing boat ".

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Hong Kong) Order, 1936.

may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order: and direct the manner in which for the purposes of the constitution of a juvenile court in that area two justices of the peace for the County of London shall be selected from the panel of such justices nominated from time to time by the Secretary of State:

And whereas such an Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the purposes of the Order and such Orders in Council may by section 105 of the said Act be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the fifth day of October, 1934 (S.R. & O. 1934 (No. 1132) I, p. 870):

Now, therefore, Mis Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) the Order in Council made on the fifth day of October, 1934, is hereby varied by the substitution in the schedule of the words "Springfield Hall, 200, Wandsworth Road, S.W.8" for the words "Lambeth Town Hall, Brixton Hill, S.W.2."

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 1st April, 1936.
