PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of February, 1936 (G.H.), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the posts of the Clerk employed in the Office of the Royal Hospital Estate at Greenwich and of the Clerk in the Office of the Receiver and Agent and Officer in Charge of Works, Royal Hospital School, Holbrook, should be regarded as established and pensionable posts as from the 7th November, 1934, and that a revised scale of salary should be prescribed for these posts from the same date:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to approve of these two posts being regarded as established and pensionable posts under conditions similar to those laid down in the Superannuation Acts, and to sanction for them the scale of salary authorised from time to time for Third Grade Clerks in the Admiralty Service, all with effect from the 7th day of November, 1934."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of February, 1936, (E.51/36), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having

been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas various rates of extra duty pay were approved by Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1923, for non-commissioned officers and men employed in appointments at Royal Marine Establishments:

"And whereas as from 1st April, 1936, the making up of Royal Naval and Royal Marine clothing at the Royal Marine Divisions at Portsmouth, Plymouth and Chatham, will be conducted as a direct Admiralty manufacturing service, in lieu of the existing arrangement under which the Master Tailors (Colour Sergeants or Sergeants, R.M.) carry out the work at a price per garment and pay staff and expenses therefrom:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following payments at the Royal Marine Divisions as from 1st April, 1936:

"To Master Tailors appointed as such after 31st March, 1936:—

"A fixed and non-pensionable salary of £350 per annum, in addition to the service pay and allowances of their Royal Marine rank, and a variable bonus, as an incentive to minimising cutting and other expenses, not exceeding £50 per annum.

"Master Tailors at present holding such appointments to receive a fixed and non-pensionable salary of £500 per annum, in addition to service pay and allowances and a variable bonus not exceeding £50 per annum.

"To Royal Marine ranks employed as Tailors:—

"Working pay at current rates based on Trade Board rates and taking into consideration the fact that these men also receive the service pay and allowances of their rank.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that the Legislature of any colony may, with the approval of His Majesty

in Council, make provision for maintaining and using vessels of war; and that where the legislature of any colony has made provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the colony within its territorial waters, that legislature may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, further make such provision regarding the discipline and service of officers and men of that force as is set out in the Act:

And whereas by the Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council may, on such conditions as He thinks fit, authorise the Admiralty to accept any offer made by the Government of a colony to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy, vessels of war maintained, or officers or men of such force as aforesaid raised by the colony:

And whereas by the Naval Volunteer Reserve Ordinance, 1934, as amended by the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935, of the Legislature of the Colony of the Straits Settlements (hereinafter referred to as "the Legislature") provision has been made for raising a force for the Naval Defence of the Straits Settlements called the Straits Settlements Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve (hereinafter referred to as "the Force"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Straits Settlements Naval Defence Order, 1936."

2. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the power contained in Section 1 of the Act, to make provision at the expense of the Colony for maintaining and using vessels of war.

3. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of the Straits Settlements to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any vessel of war so maintained, provided that, as regards any such vessel maintained by the Colony of the Straits Settlements in conjunction with any other Colony, a like offer is made by such last mentioned Colony.

4. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the powers contained in Subsection (i) of Section 2 of the Act namely, to provide that officers and men of the Force—

(a) shall, whether serving ashore or afloat or within or without the limits of the Straits Settlements, be subject to all the enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy, with such modifications and adaptations as may be made by the Legislature to adapt those enactments and regulations to the circumstances of the Straits Settlements;

(b) shall be liable to service and training in any ship, establishment or other place without the limits of the Straits Settlements, whether belonging to the Straits Settlements or not;

(c) shall, in the case of officers or men entered on the express terms of accepting general service in the Royal Navy in emergency, form part of the Royal Naval Reserve or of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or that some shall form part of the Royal Naval Reserve and others of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

5. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of the Straits Settlements to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any officers and men of the Force.

CATHEDRAL MEASURES, 1931 AND 1934.

Notice is hereby given that His Majesty in Council was pleased on the 3rd day of March, 1936, to approve Orders in Council under the above named Measures, confirming Schemes, prepared by the Cathedral Commissioners for England, for the Cathedral Churches of St. Paul in London, Bury St. Edmunds, Chichester, Derby, Sheffield, Wells and Winchester respectively.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th March, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1888, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd March, 1936, to Saturday, the 28th March, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 16 and 18. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the examination.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are

duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. Handwriting.
3. History.
4. Geography.
5. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

6. The Examination is open only to local candidates. A local candidate is regarded as one whose family home (i.e. with parents or guardians) is situated where she can travel to and from the office conveniently and without detriment to her health or the interests of the Department. No candidate will be eligible for appointment unless she can satisfy the Postmaster-General that she possesses the required local residential qualification and it will be within the Postmaster-General's authority to decline to employ a candidate successful in the examination if he is not satisfied that she complies with this requirement. If there is any doubt an intending candidate is advised to enquire of the Head Postmaster of the town at which the situation is vacant (not the Civil Service Commissioners) whether, in the event of her success in the examination, she would be regarded as eligible for appointment in respect of residence.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.
