WHEREAS it is enacted by section 84 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, that His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time direct that there shall be in such places as are specified in the Order District Registries of the High Court for districts to be defined in the Order:

And whereas it is desirable that there should be a District Registry of the High Court at Eastbourne:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. There shall be a District Registry of the High Court at Eastbourne, and the district thereof shall be the area comprising the County Court district of the County Court of Sussex held at Eastbourne.

2. This Order may be cited as the District Registries (Eastbourne) Order, 1936, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1936.

prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of March, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Swarraton with Northington, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover and Swarraton with Northington duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover is now full the Reverend Arthur John Wade-Gery being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Swarraton with Northington is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of both of the said Benefices of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover and Swarraton with Northington

now belongs to the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur John Wade-Gery (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

- "1. That the said Benefice of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover and the said Benefice of Swarraton with Northington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brown Candover with Swarraton and Northington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur John Wade-Gery if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Swarraton with Northington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "4. That upon the union taking effect the net income derived by the Incumbent of the United Benefice from all the tithe rentcharges vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty and formerly attached to the said two Benefices of Brown Candover with Chilton Candover and Swarraton with Northington respectively and from the proceeds of the redemption of any such tithe rentcharges and from the securities representing the accumulations of sinking fund payments in respect of the same tithe rentcharges upon the extinguishment thereof in accordance with the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1925, shall be appropriated and distributed by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty as follows, that is to say, as to eleven fourteenth parts of such net income in payment to the Incumbent of the United Benefice and as to the remaining three fourteenth parts thereof in payment to the Incumbents of the two Benefices next mentioned in the following shares that is to say one two-thirds share to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Romsey, and one one-third share to the Incumbent of the Benefice of New Alresford, both of which Benefices are situate in the said Diocese of Winchester, and the net income derived from any such tithe rentcharge so vested in the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty shall be the balance payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice under the provisions of Section 5 of the Tithe Act, 1925, after the transfer payment and deductions made in accordance with the same Section from the gross amount actually collected from time to time.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the

matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or Ecclesiastical transmitted the said to Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for assigning the right of Patronage of the District of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1933, and published in the London Gazette on the 15th day of the same month the said District of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, constituted out of the New Parish of All Saints, Squirrell's Heath, in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas no assignment of the Patronage of the said District of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, was made by the said Order and no such assignment has since been

"And whereas a capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the principal contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly

be effected:

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Michael, Gidea Park, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any

other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

MERTON COLLEGE, OXFORD. AMENDMENT OF COLLEGE STATUTE.

And whereas it is provided by section 25 (2) of the said Order that the aforesaid parts shall form part of the County of Derby for the purposes of the functions of Coroners but no provision has been made by the said Order for adding the same to any Coroner's district:

And whereas the Council of the County of Derby have pursuant to section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing that the aforesaid parts shall be constituted a separate Coroner's district within the County of Derby:

Now therefore I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of Derby into Coroners' districts shall be altered and that the said County shall be divided into three Coroners' districts which shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :-

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COMPETI-TIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANT NATURALISTS IN THE FISHERIES DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

Appointments under these Regulations are open to candidates of either sex. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate for the post of Assistant Naturalist must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the last day fixed for the receipt of appli-

cations.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.
