And whereas by the Air Navigation (Jersey) Order, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), His late Majesty King George the Fifth was pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order that the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, as amended by the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, should apply to Jersey as set out and modified in the Appendix to such Order:

And whereas by the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Jersey) Order, 1929, His said late Majesty was pleased to amend the Principal Order as therein appears:

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order should be further amended as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule IV to the Appendix to the Principal Order:—

(1) In the proviso to paragraph 7 the word "report" shall be substituted for the word "reports";

(2) From sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 8 the words "to the officer of His Majesty's Customs and Excise in Jersey and" and the word "respectively" shall be omitted;

(3) In sub-paragraph (d) of paragraph 8 the word "report" shall be substituted for the word "reports";

(4) For sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 9 the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted:—

"(1) The pilot of every aircraft about to proceed direct to any place outside Jersey shall deliver to a States Customs Officer—

(a) A notice of departure with a list containing the names of passengers and also, if the aircraft carries goods, a manifest and declaration in the form prescribed jointly by the Committee and the Finance Committee in which shall be truly stated the particulars required by such form, which form when signed by such Officer shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed to its intended destination, and

(b) the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft";

(5) In paragraph 11 the word "report" shall be substituted for the word "reports" and the word "has" shall be substituted for the word "have".

2. This Order shall be registered in the Royal Court of the Island of Jersey.

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Jersey) Order, 1936.

And whereas by the Air Navigation (Guernsey) Order, 1926 (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"), His late Majesty King George the Fifth was pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order that the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, as amended by the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, should apply to Guernsey as set out and modified in the Appendix to such Order:

And whereas by the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order, 1929, His said late Majesty was pleased to amend the Principal Order as therein appears:

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order as so amended should be further amended as hereinafter appears:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule IV to the Appendix to the Principal Order:—

(1) In the proviso to paragraph 7 the word "report" shall be substituted for the word "reports";

(2) From sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 8 the words "to the Officer of His Majesty's Customs and Excise in Guernsey and" and the word "respectively" shall be omitted;

also, if the aircraft carries goods, a manifest and declaration in the form prescribed by the Board in which shall be truly stated the particulars required by such form, which form when signed by such Officer shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed to its intended destination, and

(b) the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft";

(5) In paragraph 11 the word "report" shall be substituted for the word "reports" and the word "has" shall be substituted for the word "have".

2. This Order shall be registered in the Royal Court of the Island of Guernsey, and this Order, the Principal Order, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order, 1929, shall be registered in the Court of Alderney together with the Air Navigation Act, 1920.

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (Guernsey) Order, 1936.

WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places (which, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2 & 3 Vict. c. 71 and 3 & 4 Vict. c. 84), may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order: and direct the manner in which for the purposes of the constitution of a juvenile court in that area two justices of the peace for the County of London shall be selected from the panel of such justices nominated from time to time by the Secretary of State:

And whereas such an Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the purposes of the Order and such Orders in Council may by section 105 of the said Act be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the fifth day of October, 1934 (S.R. & O. 1934 (No. 1132) I, p. 870):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) the Order in Council made on the fifth day of October, 1934, is hereby varied by the substitution in the schedule of the words "Southwark Juvenile Court, 298, Borough High Street, S.E.1." for the words "Deptford Town Hall, New Cross Road, S.E.14."

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 1st May, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29, 4-5 Geo. 5. c. 48, 9-10 Geo. 5, c. 80, 18-19 Geo. 5. c. 3 and 22-23 Geo. 5. c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Late Majesty King George V and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas the Tangier Zone of Morocco has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of the Tangier Zone of Morocco the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the Tangier Zone of Morocco or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of the Tangier Zone of Morocco confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the Tangier Zone of Morocco or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to the Tangier Zone of Morocco.

3. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Morocco (Tangier Zone)) Order, 1936.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the territories of Africa now known as the Nyasaland Protectorate (hereinafter called "the Protectorate") are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the Protectorate:

And whereas it is expedient that the customary rights of natives of the Protectorate to use and enjoy the land of the Protectorate and the natural fruits thereof in sufficient quantity to enable them to provide for the sustenance of themselves, their families and their posterity should be assured, protected, and preserved:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Nyasaland Protectorate (Native Trust Land) Order in Council, 1936.

2. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—"Crown lands" means all lands and interests in land acquired or occupied by or on behalf of His Majesty.

"public purposes" includes—

(a) for exclusive Government use, for the use of the native inhabitants of the Protectorate, or for general public use;

(b) for or in connection with sanitary improvements of any kind;

(c) for or in connection with the laying out of any new township, or Government station, or the extension or improvement of any existing township or Government station;

(d) for obtaining control over land required for or in connection with mining;

(e) for or in connection with the conservation of trees.

"reserved lands" means—

(a) lands other than Crown lands included in any township;

(b) lands other than Crown lands as set out in the Schedule to this Order;

(c) proclaimed forest reserves excluding Crown lands therein;

(d) all lands and interests in land (other than yearly tenancies) granted, leased, or otherwise disposed of by the Governor before the date of this Order and all other interests in land retained or reserved upon any such disposal;

(e) all lands and interests in land held at the date of this Order under any certificate of claim (except Certificate of Claim No. 61) the validity of which has been recognised by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State and all lands and interests in land granted, leased, or otherwise disposed of by the holders of any such certificates of claim:

For the purpose of this paragraph the words "interests in land" shall not include any interest in land which consists solely of the rights to the minerals therein.

(f) All lands held under Certificate of Claim No. 61, and all lands and interests in land granted, leased, or otherwise disposed of by the holders of Certificate of Claim No. 61;

"minerals" means all mineral substances and mineral oils wherever found.

"native" means a native of the Protectorate not being of European or Asiatic race or origin.

"native authority" means a native authority established under the Native Authority Ordinance, 1933, or any Ordinance amending or substituted for that Ordinance.

"treasury" means a native treasury established under the Native Authority Ordinance, 1933, or any Ordinance amending or substituted for that Ordinance.

"Secretary of State" means the person for the time being holding the office of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies.

3.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Governor at anytime by notice in the Nyasaland Protectorate Gazette to amend the Schedule to this Order by reducing the area of all or any of the reserved lands set out therein.

(2) When any part of the lands or interests in land specified in paragraphs (d) or (e) of the definition of "reserved lands" in Article 2 of this Order revert or are surrendered to the Government of the Protectorate they shall remain reserved lands or become native trust land within the meaning of Article 4 of this Order as the Governor may decide.

(3) When any part of the lands or interests in land specified in paragraph (f) of the definition of "reserved lands" in Article 2 of this Order are surrendered to the Government of the Protectorate they shall become native trust land within the meaning of Article 4 of this Order.

4. The whole of the lands of the Protectorate, except Crown lands and reserved lands, are hereby declared to be native trust land.

5.—(1) All native trust land is hereby vested in the Secretary of State and shall, subject to the provisions of this Order and to the general or special directions of the Secretary of State, be administered and controlled by the Governor for the use or common benefit, direct or indirect, of the natives of the Protectorate.

(2) No titles claimed by persons other than natives to the use and occupation of any such land shall be valid unless and until they have been confirmed by the Governor.

6.—(1) The Governor may, subject to the general or special directions of the Secretary of State, where it appears to him to be for the common benefit, direct or indirect, of the

natives of the Protectorate, and having regard to the native laws and customs existing in the district in which the land is situated—

(a) grant rights of occupancy of native trust land to natives and to non-natives;

(b) demand a rental for the use of any native trust land granted to any native or non-native;

(c) revise the said rental at intervals of not more than thirty-three years;

(d) acquire native trust land for public purposes;

(e) exchange for any interest in reserved lands a right of occupancy in any native trust land; Provided that the acreage of such reserved lands is not less than the acreage of native trust land in which the right of occupancy is granted. On such exchange the land surrendered shall become native trust land:

Provided that before any native trust land in an area over which a native authority has been established is so disposed of the said native authority shall be consulted.

(2) The whole of the proceeds of any such disposal shall be paid either into the treasury (if any) of the said native authority or into a central fund for the purpose of making grants to such treasuries; Provided that where any right of occupancy is granted in pursuance of an exchange effected in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (e) of paragraph (1) of this article the proceeds of such disposal may be paid into the general revenue of the Protectorate.

(3) Compensation shall be paid to individual natives disturbed and payments shall be made to the treasury (if any) of the native authority concerned or to the central fund in respect of any native trust land acquired by the Governor for a public purpose.

(4) Rights of occupancy shall be for any term not exceeding ninety-nine years, and shall be granted subject to the terms of any contract which may be made between the Governor and the occupier; Provided that the Governor shall not (save in the case of a right granted in connection with a mining lease) grant rights of occupancy to any non-native free of rent or upon any condition which may preclude him from revising the rent at intervals of not more than thirty-three years.

7. The entire property in and control of all minerals in under or upon any native trust land are save in so far as any part thereof may have been the subject of alienation duly ratified by the Crown, or in relation to which prospecting or mining rights subsist by virtue of express grant made by the Governor, hereby vested in the Secretary of State and shall be administered and controlled by the Governor for the use or common benefit, direct or indirect, of the natives of the Protectorate.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by this article the Governor may, subject to the provisions of the laws and regulations for the time being in force in the Protectorate, make grants to search for and work minerals, but in so doing he shall have regard to general native interests and shall consult the native authority of the area concerned. In the event of any difference of opinion, the matter shall be referred for decision to the Secretary of State.

The whole of the proceeds of any such grant, or such part thereof as may be determined by the Governor with the approval of the Secretary of State, shall be paid either into the treasury of the said native authority or into a central fund for the purpose of grants to the treasuries of native authorities.

8. Nothing contained in this Order or in any regulations made thereunder shall affect any grants ratified by the Crown relating to the ownership of mines or minerals, and any person entitled to the exercise of such rights on native trust land may enter therein together with other persons employed by him for the purpose of exercising such rights subject to the provisions of the laws and regulations for the time being in force in the Protectorate.

9. The Governor may, from time to time, with the approval of the Secretary of State, make, alter, amend and revoke regulations for the purpose of this Order, and in particular may by such regulations control and limit in the interests of native occupation the entry upon or user of native trust land by any person other than natives, and may prescribe as penalties for the breach of any such regulations a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or both such fine and imprisonment.

10. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors in Council may, from time to time, revoke, add to, alter, or amend this Order.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the Nyasaland Protectorate Gazette.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Vicarage of Barnstaple the Parish whereof contains a population of 3,320 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 1,000 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Barnstaple is £458 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Rectory of Tawstock the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,165 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 450 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Tawstock is £958 or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Tawstock (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with pink) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Barnstaple to which it is contiguous.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Barnstaple is the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Exeter and the Reverend Prebendary Frank Maxwell Wallington is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patron of the Benefice of Tawstock is Sir Philip Bouchier Sherard Wrey, Baronet, of Tawstock, Devon, and the Reverend Albany Bouchier Sherard Wrey is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rentcharges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

“ SCHEME.

“ It is proposed to separate from the said Parish of Tawstock and annex to the said Parish of Barnstaple all that part of the Parish of Tawstock the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance plan hereto annexed and edged with pink.

“ That the Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnstaple shall have sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within such portion so to be separated from Tawstock.

“ That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Barnstaple but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Tawstock.

“ That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Barnstaple as they might have had in the Parish Church of Tawstock.

“ That all fees Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Tawstock shall belong to the Incumbent of Barnstaple.

“ That the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge specified in the Schedule hereto arising out of the lands proposed to be separated from Tawstock and added to the Parish of Barnstaple shall become the property of the Incumbent of Barnstaple.

“ That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
