His Majesty found the Troops drawn out in Two Lines, being 28 Battalions of Foot, and 31 Squadrons of Horie and Dragoons, and was very well satisfied with the good Condition they all appeared in. The General Review being over, all the Horse and Dragoons passed by His Majesty in fingle Troops. There was a great Concourfe of the Nobility and Gentry of these Parts and from Holland; The French Ambassador, Count Tallard, was alto there, and after the Review waited upon His Majesty hither. This morning His Majesty returned to the Camp again, to see the Foot likewife pass by in single Companies; And to morrow the Forces will begin to File off towards their respective Garisons, and His Majesty designs to return to Leo. 'Tis said, His Majesty will begin his Journey to Cell about the 30th of this month.

Hagne, Septemb. 19. The Baron d'Obrezinsky,

Envoy from the Elector of Brandenbourg, who came some days ago from Loo, is gone for Berlin, but will return hither in a short time. The Count d'Auvergne is also come to this place from Loo. The Baron of Bloemberg, Envoy from the Duke of Courland, defigns to take his Audience of Leave of the States General to morrow, and in a few days to begin his Journey home. Monsieur d'Odyke, Ambassador Extraordinary from this State at the French Court, is expected back the next month; and Monsieur Heemskirke, his Col-

legue is to continue there.

Paris, Sept. 20. N. S. The Court continues at Compeigne, where the young Princes of France have been Entertained with several Representations of Sieges, Attacks, and Battles, The King intends on Wednesday next to return to Versailles; and the 3d of the next month he will go to Fon-tainebleau.
