CONVOCAION OF CANTERBURY.

ADDRESS TO HIS MAJESTY THE KING.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops, and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury assembled in Convocation on January 22nd, the day of the Proclamation of Your Majesty's accession to the Throne, approach Your Majesty with dutiful assurance of our devotion to your Royal Throne and Person.

It is with full hearts that we exercise our ancient privilege of addressing Your Majesty on the opening of a new Convocation. Not forty-eight hours have elapsed since our late beloved King breathed his last. Our first impulse must needs be to offer to Your Majesty, to the Queen and to all the Members of the Royal House our heartfelt sympathy in this hour of sorrow and bereavement. It is our hope that Your Majesty may find strength and comfort in the knowledge that the grief of the Royal Family is shared by countless multitudes of Your Majesty's subjects in every quarter of the globe.

And yet, in the midst of sorrow, we are filled with a sense of profound thankfulness for all that we owe to our late beloved Sovereign. For over twenty-five years, with his faithful Consort at his side, he laboured unceasingly

to maintain the prestige of the British Monarchy and to serve with single-hearted devotion the people committed to his charge. His achievement was to bequeath to his successor a stable Throne; to win the loyalty and the love of a united people was his richly merited reward.

Standing as we do on the threshold of a new Reign and looking out into the future, we rejoice to remember the conspicuous and varied services which Your Majesty has already rendered to this Realm and Empire and the secure place which you have already won in the affection of your people at home and overseas. It is with hearts full of hope that we wish Your Majesty Godspeed as you enter upon the arduous duties and manifold responsibilities of your exalted station. We commend to your favour and protection the Church which we represent and its endeavour to make the Christian religion a living power in this and other lands.

At this solemn moment in the history of our country we desire to assure Your Majesty of our resolve to sustain you with our allegiance and to surround you with our prayers. We shall ever pray that the Holy Spirit may guide you throughout the coming years, and that the Blessing of Almighty God may rest upon Your Majesty, upon the Queen, and upon every Member of the Royal House.

CONVOCAATION OF YORK.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,

The Humble Address of the Convocation of the Province of York.

May it please Your Majesty,—

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops, and Clergy of the Province of York, in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We meet under the shadow of a national grief. The death of King George the Fifth, Your Majesty's Royal Father, has united all his people in a common sorrow. For twenty-five years his courageous leadership, his self-denying service of his country, his devotion to duty and his ready sympathy with his subjects in all their joys and sorrows, have been an inspiration and a source of stability and strength to his whole Realm. The expression of honour and affection felt for him throughout the Empire and throughout the world at the time of the Silver Jubilee was proof of the place which he had won in the hearts of all men.

We recall with especial gratitude his deep concern for all that affected the welfare of the Church, the simple affection belonging to home and family life in which he allowed his people to share, and the sure trust in God which sustained him through so many trials.

To Your Majesty now succeeding him upon the Throne we offer the homage of our hearts. We are grateful for all that Your Majesty has done for the unity of the Empire and for the promotion of friendship between our own and other lands. We also rejoice in the many proofs which Your Majesty has given of interest in industrial conditions, of sympathy with the distressed, and of concern for the welfare of youth. We give thanks to Almighty God that He has raised to the Throne of our country and empire one who has already gained affection and confidence from those over whom he is called to reign.

We notice with joy the improvement of trade which has delivered many of our fellow-citizens from the calamity of unemployment; but we dare not ignore or forget the fact that in some parts of our Province recovery is delayed. The misery and the risk of moral deterioration

which are inseparable from prolonged unemployment constitute a claim upon the sympathy of all Christian people and upon their thoughtful co-operation in wisely planned efforts for alleviation of those evils.

We rejoice that our country has shewn so decided a purpose to play its part within the family of nations in the effort to maintain justice and peace. We join our prayers with those of our fellow Christians in all lands that God will be pleased to preserve the world from the horrors of warfare and to quicken in the hearts of all men that spirit of love which is the only guarantee of peace.

And we shall ever pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly upon Your Majesty's Person, Your Royal Family and Realm.

A LOYAL AND DUTIFUL ADDRESS OF CONDOLENCE TO HIS MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY KING EDWARD THE EIGHTH ON THE DEATH OF HIS ROYAL FATHER KING GEORGE THE FIFTH, AND OF CONGRATULATION ON HIS OWN ACCESSION TO THE THRONE.

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Oxford, venture to approach Your Majesty in this time of your deep sorrow and to present to you our humble condolence. In common with the whole British Empire—we may almost say with the whole world—we mourn the death of a beloved King, a man wise in counsel, resolute in duty, courageous and steadfast in adversity, a Father to all the peoples in His dominions. And our sense of loss is the greater in that we have peculiar ties which bind us to your Royal House. You, Sire, have shared the life of our University and your Undergraduate

days are still a vivid memory to many of us. Your illustrious Father and Her Majesty Queen Mary were both graciously pleased to accept Degrees at our hands. As we then lament the loss of the first name on our roll, so we ask leave to express a special sympathy with Your Majesty in your bereavement.

Together with our condolence we desire to offer to you, Sire, our homage on your accession to the highest position of dignity and responsibility in the land. The reign of King George the Fifth of blessed and glorious memory has established the throne of England on a firmer basis than ever before, and has vindicated the place of monarchy in a free and democratic State. We rejoiced to hear Your Majesty's solemn undertaking to walk in your Father's steps, and, knowing your powers, your gift of sympathy and understanding, and your devotion to your peoples, we are confident that the high example which He set will be faithfully followed. We beg to assure Your Majesty of our deep and constant loyalty, and we venture to hope that, notwithstanding the wider claims now made upon you, Your Majesty will still retain your affection for your University and will continue to bestow your favour upon it. And we pray to Almighty God that your reign may be long, prosperous and peaceful, and that all happiness may attend Your Majesty in the coming years.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,
May it please your Majesty,—

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful subjects, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, humbly ask leave to offer Your Majesty our heartfelt sympathy and to express the grief which we share with all Your Majesty's subjects on the death of Your Royal Father of blessed and most gracious memory. We do not forget how personal must be Your Majesty's sorrow when ties so intimate are broken, yet in approaching Your Majesty we feel assured by the knowledge of Your beloved Father's wish, so amply fulfilled, that as he laboured unceasingly for the common welfare of all his subjects, so they should regard themselves as bound to him in the spirit of one family. To him as the head of a world-wide

family we looked with the grateful devotion which his life compelled.

The acute internal dissensions amid which the reign of His Majesty King George V began had not passed before his people were tried by the greatest of wars and threatened by its most instant perils. His faith and steadfastness upheld his people, and so earned their trust that amid the general ruin of dynasties his throne was more firmly established. In the difficult years that followed, his message to his people was ever of hope and resolution, seeking always ordered progress and settled peace, finding consolation in the quiet government and tranquil association that prevailed throughout the "Commonwealth of Peace" whose head he was, not only a symbol of sovereignty and unity but a source of wisdom and beneficence for all the free peoples of a vast and varied Empire.

For His late Majesty, in twenty-five long years there was no respite. His sure understanding and singleness of mind interpreted through varying Ministries the best in men's hearts beneath political divisions. He represented all the history of his people and was moved by affection for all his subjects, sharing their troubles, rejoicing in their happiness, proud of their achievements and convincing them of his kindness and goodwill. On his record might be set this ancient sentence for a seal: "But that which put glory of grace into all that He did was that He did it of pure love for His Country."

On this ancient University, by whose commission we approach You, Your Royal Ancestors have conferred many favours. Of Your Majesty's interest and support we are no less confident. For centuries the University of Cambridge has sought knowledge for the benefit of all mankind and brought up youth to serve the State. With a strong faith in these traditions we humbly beg Your Majesty to accept this testimony of our allegiance.

And we pray that the blessing of Almighty God may be bestowed upon Your Majesty, as on Your Royal Father, throughout a long and glorious reign.

On the 26th day of March, 1936, the Minister of Health notified his approval of the Resolution of the Cumberland County Council, dated the 5th day of February, 1936, deciding to prepare the above Planning Scheme with reference to an area situate within the Border Rural District. 2. The Map defining the area to which the Resolution applies has been deposited at the Offices of the Cumberland County Council, The Courts, Carlisle, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 10 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays. 3. Any person who is,

or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area, and any Association representing owners of property within the Border Rural District and any Local Association representing business or industry may, by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Cumberland County Council to register, without charge, his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and, in addition, the Border Rural District Council are empowered to permit other development in

the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Cumberland County Council intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the draft scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.
