TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 17th April, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 20th April, 1936, to Saturday, the 25th April, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

FINANCE ACT, 1921.

PART YEAR LICENCES.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by Section 22 of the Finance Act, 1921, has made The Road Vehicles (Part Year Licensing) Order, 1936.

The Order provides that except in the case of cycles a licence may be taken out either for the period from 29th day of May, 1936, to 30th day of June, 1936, or for the period from 29th day of May, 1936, to 31st day of December, 1936, and the duty payable on such licence shall be the sum which would have been payable thereon under the provisions of the Road Vehicles (Part Year Licensing) Order, 1924, and the Road Vehicles (Part Year Licensing) (Amendment) Order, 1928, for a licence taken out for the period from 1st day of June to 30th day of June, or for the period from 1st day of June to 31st day of December, as the case may be, together with the additional sum, in the case of vehicles on which the annual rate of duty payable is less than £30, of seven shillings and sixpence, and on which the annual rate of duty payable is £30 or over, of fifteen shillings.
