WALCOT HOME FOR GIRLS, BATH.

(Formerly the Industrial School for Girls.)

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, being satisfied in view of the addition of new premises at 40, Grosvenor Place, Bath, that there is now accommodation at the Walcot Home for Girls for not more than 70 girls, he has issued a new Certificate increasing from 55 to 70 the number of such girls to be received in the School at any one time, sent thereto in pursuance of the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, or of any other Act, or otherwise.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made Orders authorising the employment on two day-shifts of:—

(a) Male young persons over 16 years of age in attending circular knitting machines at the works of Messrs. W. F. Ward & Co., Ltd., Tyrrell Street, Leicestershire, subject to conditions as to weekly alternation of shifts, accommodation for clothing and facilities for washing and for taking meals.

(b) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in the "Quencher" department at the works of Messrs. Dunn & Co. (Sunderland), Ltd., Burn Park, Sunderland, subject to similar conditions and to a condition that transport facilities may be required.

(c) Women over 18 years of age in weaving printers blankets at the Spring Bank Mills of Messrs. Kershaw & Sons, Ltd., Mossley, subject to conditions similar to those under (b).

(d) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in pickling at the works of The Elba Tinsplate Co., Ltd., Crymlyn Burrows, Swansea, subject to conditions as to weekly alternation of shifts and that transport facilities may be required.

(e) Women and young persons over 16 years of age in the cardroom at the B.B. Silk Mills of Messrs. Burnet, Walker & Co., Mill Lane, Cheadle, Cheshire, subject to conditions similar to those under (a) and to the taking of additional humidity readings.
