

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

(a) In wire stitching of booklets in the bindery at the works of Messrs. John Waddington Ltd., Wakefield Road, Leeds, subject to conditions as to weekly alternation of shifts, accommodation for clothing and facilities for washing and for taking meals.

(b) In lithographic printing, varnishing, enamelling and lacquering on metal plates at the works of Messrs. Paton, Calvert & Co. Ltd., Binns Road, Old Swan, Liverpool, subject to similar conditions and to a condition that transport facilities may be required.
