**CEREMONIALS OBSERVED AT THE FUNERAL AND LYING IN STATE OF HIS LATE MAJESTY KING GEORGE THE FIFTH OF BLESSED MEMORY.**

**FROM SANDRINGHAM TO WESTMINSTER HALL,  
THURSDAY, JANUARY 23RD, 1936.**

On Tuesday, January 21st, the Coffin containing the Royal Remains was taken to Sandringham Parish Church, and lay there, guarded by men employed on the Royal Estate at Sandringham, one standing at each corner of the Bier, until the following Thursday.

On Thursday, January 23rd, a Guard of Honour of the Sandringham Company of the Fifth Battalion the Royal Norfolk Regiment was mounted at Wolferton Station. After a short Service, conducted by the Bishop of Norwich and the Reverend Arthur Rose Fuller, Rector of Sandringham, at which HIS MAJESTY THE KING, HER MAJESTY QUEEN MARY, and other Members of the Royal Family were present, and which was attended by the Ladies and Gentlemen of the Household in Waiting, His Majesty's Lieutenant of the County (Russell James Colman Esq.) and others, the Royal Coffin was taken from Sandringham Church by a Bearer Party of the King's Company Grenadier Guards, and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by "F" Battery, Royal Horse Artillery.

HIS MAJESTY THE KING, His Royal Highness The Duke of York, His Royal Highness The Duke of Gloucester, His Royal Highness The Duke of Kent, and the Earl of Harewood followed the Royal Coffin on foot, and after them drove HER MAJESTY QUEEN MARY, accompanied by Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal and Her Royal Highness The Duchess of York, in a carriage, and Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Gloucester, and Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Kent, with the Lady Desborough and Lady Elizabeth Motion, in another carriage, followed by the Gentlemen of the Household, Heads of departments and Employees on the Sandringham Estate.
