After the Service HIS MAJESTY THE KING, HER MAJESTY QUEEN MARY, and the other Members of the Royal Family were conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Earl Marshal, and the Officers of Arms to the entrance of Westminster Hall.

The Route taken by the Procession from King's Cross Railway Station to Westminster

Hall was lined by Police.

The Remains of His late Majesty King George the Fifth, of Blessed Memory, lay in State in Westminster Hall from Thursday the 23rd day of January, to Tuesday the 28th day of the same month.

During the Lying in State, Four Gentlemen at Arms stood at the head of the Coffin, and four Yeomen of the Guard stood at the four corners of the Catafalque. Four Officers of the Household Cavalry, and four of the Brigade of Guards, alternately, were also stationed on either

The Public was admitted to Westminster Hall from Friday the 24th to Tuesday the 28th of January.

FROM WESTMINSTER HALL TO WINDSOR, TUESDAY JANUARY 28TH, 1936.

Guards of Honour were mounted at Westminster Hall and Paddington Railway Station. At 9.45 o'clock in the morning the Royal Coffin was removed from Westminster Hall by a Bearer Party of the Brigade of Guards and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by Naval Ratings, and the Crown, Sceptre and Orb laid thereon.
