DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

Whereas Eric Leonard Dobson, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., of 21, New Cavendish Street, London, W.1, and 92, Kingsley Way, Golders Green, N.2, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Eric Leonard Dobson cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Eric Leonard Dobson, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Eric Leonard Dobson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
