

"9. That upon the union taking effect any real or personal property now held or applicable under any special trust as a repair fund or for any other purpose in relation to the fabric of the Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, or the ornaments thereof or for payment of the expenses of maintaining the services therein, or for the remuneration of the clergyman officiating thereat, or upon any other trust for ecclesiastical purposes in connection with the said Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, shall (in so far as the instrument, if any, creating the trust does not otherwise provide) be applied for the like purpose or object for the benefit of or in connection with the Church of Saint Simon Zelotes, Bethnal Green.

"10. That with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), as the Patron of the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice shall be excepted out of the union and shall be transferred and annexed as follows that is to say:—

(a) a sum of £12 per annum together with a payment of £18 per annum in respect of a capital sum of £400 (being further portions of the said stipend of £302 10s. 0d. per annum at present paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes) shall be transferred and annexed to the Benefice of Stepney, Saint Peter, in the said Diocese of London, and

(b) a payment of £22 10s. 0d. per annum in respect of a capital sum of £500 (being the remainder of the said stipend of £302 10s. 0d. per annum) together with a sum of £2286 1s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, shall be transferred and annexed to the Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint John, in the said Diocese of London.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the site of the Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto:

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and Acts, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time

prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
